FUNDS/FUNDING: Provides for the imposition of fines for driving offenses.

DIGEST

<u>Present law</u> provides for the crime of operating a motor vehicle while impaired and imposes penalties for violations. The fines imposed upon the conviction of the various offenses are as follows:

(1) First Offense Not less than \$300 nor more than \$1,000

(2) Second Offense Not less than \$750 nor more than \$1,000

(3) Third Offense \$2,000

(4) Fourth or Subsequent Offense \$5,000

<u>Proposed law</u> adds the following additional fines upon conviction for each offense:

(1) First Offense \$25

(2) Second Offense \$50

(3) Third Offense \$100

(4) Fourth or Subsequent Offense \$250

<u>Present law</u> provides for the crime of reckless operation of a vehicle and imposes penalties for violations. The fine for a first offense conviction is not more than \$200. The fine imposed upon the conviction of the second or subsequent offenses is not less than \$25 nor more than \$500.

Proposed law adds the following additional fines upon conviction for each offense:

(1) First Offense \$5

(2) Second or Subsequent Offense \$10

<u>Present law</u> provides for the crime of reckless operation of an off-road vehicle and imposes penalties for violations. The fine for a conviction is not more than \$500.

<u>Proposed law</u> adds an additional fine upon conviction of \$5.

<u>Present law</u> provides for speeding violations. Penalties are imposed by each parish or municipality where the offense occurred.

Proposed law adds an additional fine of \$5 to each speeding violation (R.S. 32:61 and 64).

<u>Present law</u> provides for violations for drag racing and racing on public roads and certain property. The fines imposed upon the conviction of the various offenses are as follows:

If no serious personal injury involved:

(1) First Offense not more than \$175

(2) Subsequent Offense not more than \$500

If serious bodily injury or death occurs, then the fine shall be not less than \$500 or more than \$2,000.

Proposed law adds an additional fine of \$10 to each drag racing violation.

<u>Proposed law</u> instructs the sheriff to collect each of the additional fines imposed and forward to the state treasurer for deposit into the La. Emergency Response Network Fund.

<u>Present law</u> establishes the La. Emergency Response Network Fund. Monies in the fund are used to fund grants, projects, and services to support the board of the La. Emergency Response Network. The board's objectives are to decrease trauma, stroke, and STEMI-related deaths. <u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u>.

Effective upon signature of governor or lapse of gubernatorial action.

(Adds R.S.14:98.1(A)(4), 98.2(A)(5), 98.3(A)(4), 98.4(A)(3), 99(C), and 99.2(F) and R.S. 32:61(C), 64(D), and 65(G))

Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

The Committee Amendments Proposed by <u>House Committee on Administration of Criminal Justice</u> to the <u>original</u> bill:

- 1. Add an additional penalty of five dollars to speeding violations.
- 2. Add an additional penalty of \$10 to drag racing violations.
- 3. Make technical changes.

Summary of Amendments Adopted by Senate

Committee Amendments Proposed by Senate Committee on Judiciary C to the reengrossed bill

1. Change official who is required to collect and forward <u>proposed law</u> fines to the state treasurer <u>from</u> the clerk of court <u>to</u> the sheriff.
