SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 144

NURSES. Requests the Louisiana Department of Health to propose solutions to the SANE nurse shortage.

1	A RESOLUTION
2	To urge and request the Louisiana Department of Health to propose solutions to the shortage
3	of SANE nurses throughout the state.
4	WHEREAS, Sexual Assault Nurse Examiners, also known as SANE nurses, are
5	registered nurses or advanced practice registered nurses that have been specifically trained
6	to provide comprehensive care to sexual assault survivors in the emergency room; and
7	WHEREAS, SANE nurses are trained to conduct forensic medical examinations that
8	include examination of physical trauma, patient interview, collection and evaluation of
9	evidence, and medical specimen collection; and
10	WHEREAS, Louisiana has an alarmingly low number of SANE nurses, with only
11	one hundred SANE nurses across the entire state, and only fifty-three of those are fully
12	certified; and
13	WHEREAS, in the rural parts of the state, there are only a few SANE nurses tasked
14	with serving vast areas and even in more densely populated areas of the state, there are
15	simply not enough SANE nurses to meet the demand; and
16	WHEREAS, on any given night, a single SANE nurse may receive calls to provide
17	care to sexual assault survivors at multiple hospitals in multiple parishes; and
18	WHEREAS, this shortage of SANE nurses creates delays in care, which leaves

1	survivors without timely access to the specialized support they urgently need; and
2	WHEREAS, survivors of sexual assault can face wait times of five to six hours
3	before they receive care from a trained SANE nurse; and
4	WHEREAS, in many emergency rooms, nurses without specific sexual assault exam
5	training are often tasked with performing rape kit exams; and
6	WHEREAS, the overwhelming majority of sexual assault survivors are women and
7	children who have just experienced a traumatic event and should not have to wait hours to
8	receive care; and
9	WHEREAS, the Louisiana Department of Health, through the medical directors of
10	each of its nine regional health service districts, is responsible for reviewing and approving
11	an annual sexual assault response plan for each district; and
12	WHEREAS, a major component of the plan should be whether there are a sufficient
13	number of SANE nurses in each region to provide timely care to sexual assault survivors;
14	and
15	WHEREAS, the Louisiana Department of Health can utilize its relationship with
16	hospitals, the Louisiana State Board of Nursing, and the Louisiana State Nurses Association
17	to identify ways to increase the number of SANE nurses in the state and ensure there is
18	adequate access to the vital services the SANE nurses provide; and
19	WHEREAS, the Louisiana Department of Health should perform a critical
20	assessment of the annual sexual assault response plan, including an evaluation of the current
21	SANE nurse employment model to identify opportunities for increased access to SANE
22	nurse services and propose solutions to ensure the sustainability of these critical services.
23	THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Senate of the Legislature of Louisiana
24	does hereby request the Louisiana Department of Health to do the following:
25	(1) Work with stakeholders to identify ways to increase the number of SANE nurses
26	in the state to ensure adequate access to the vital services provided by SANE nurses.
27	(2) Assess the current annual sexual assault response plan and SANE nurse
28	employment model to identify opportunities for increased access to SANE nurse services
29	and propose solutions to ensure the sustainability of these critical services.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be transmitted to the

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1 secretary of the Louisiana Department of Health.
