<u>Present law</u> (RS 14:54.3) provides for the crime of manufacture and possession of a bomb.

Proposed law retains present law generally.

Proposed law defines the term "enhanced security zone".

<u>Present law</u> (R.S. 14:54.3(E)) provides that whoever violates the provisions of <u>present law</u> shall be fined not more than \$10,000, imprisoned at hard labor for not more than 20 years, or both.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and provides that any person who violates the provisions of <u>present law</u> within an enhanced security zone or at a parade or demonstration for which a permit is issued by a governmental entity shall be fined not more than \$20,000, imprisoned at hard labor for not less than 20 years, or both.

<u>Present law</u> (R.S. 40:1427.3) provides for the licensure and regulation of explosives.

<u>Present law</u> requires that costs incurred by the Dept. of Public Safety and Corrections (DPS&C) for processing La. State Police and FBI fingerprint cards be borne by the applicant.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires that costs incurred by the DPS&C for conducting a background investigation and criminal history records check be borne by the applicant.

Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

The Committee Amendments Proposed by <u>House Committee on Administration of Criminal Justice</u> to the <u>engrossed</u> bill:

- 1. Make technical changes.
- 2. Define the term "enhanced security zone".
- 3. Provide that any person who manufactures or possesses a bomb within an enhanced security zone or at a parade or demonstration for which a permit is issued by a governmental entity shall be fined not more than \$20,000, imprisoned at hard labor for not less than 20 years, or both.
