Prior rule retained authority of each standing committee, joint committee, and any subcommittee, with written approval of the president, to hold hearings, subpoena witnesses, administer oaths, require the production of books and records, and to do all other things necessary to accomplish the purposes of the study, hearing, or investigation assigned to it by the Senate or by the legislature or by a majority of the members of the committee.

Prior rule provided that during the interim between sessions, a subpoena or a subpoena duces tecum shall issue only upon the approval of a majority of all the members of the standing committee and of the president and upon the rendition of a special order of the 19th JDC or of any other judicial district court, subject to general rules of venue, authorizing the committee to issue the subpoena or subpoena duces tecum, in which order the court may prescribe such requirements and conditions as it may consider just and reasonable.

New rule retained procedure for approval of a subpoena but removed the requirement for a special order rendered by the 19th JDC or other judicial court subject to general rules of venue.

New rule retained present authority of the committee or joint committee, if a subpoena is not honored, to punish for contempt and to provide for the prosecution of any individual for refusal to testify, false swearing, or perjury before the committee or subcommittee in accordance with law.
