# ACT 152 (HB 161)

# 2025 Regular Session

<u>Existing law</u> provides for the Taylor Opportunity Program for Students (TOPS), a merit scholarship program for certain students attending certain postsecondary education institutions.

#### **TOPS-Tech**

<u>Existing law</u> provides for the TOPS-Tech Award for students who enroll in certain two-year programs. Requires as a requirement for eligibility for TOPS-Tech that a student enroll in certain associate's degree or shorter-term training and education programs.

<u>Prior law</u> provided that the programs were aligned with state workforce priorities as determined by the Bd. of Regents and the La. Workforce Investment Council. <u>New law</u> (R.S. 17:5002(D)(1)) instead requires the programs to be determined by the advisory council established in existing law (R.S. 17:3047.1).

## **TOPS-Tech Early Start**

<u>Existing law</u> provides for a TOPS-Tech Early Start Award for eligible 11th and 12th grade students attending La. public high schools.

Existing law requires a student to meet one of the following eligibility requirements:

- (1) Score at least 15 on the English and mathematics subsections of the ACT PLAN assessment or a successor assessment administered as part of La.'s Educational Planning and Assessment System or the ACT, or equivalent concordant values on the SAT.
- (2) Attain a silver level score on the ACT WorkKeys assessments.

<u>New law</u> adds a third alternative: meeting the eligibility requirements for technical dual enrollment courses as determined by the Bd. of Regents.

<u>Prior law</u> provided that the award may be used at certain postsecondary education institutions for the purpose of pursuing an industry-based occupational or vocational education credential as defined by the Board of Regents when such credential also met both of the following conditions:

- (1) Was identified by the Occupation Forecasting Conference as a credential for an occupation in top demand in La.
- (2) Was recognized by the State Industry-Based Certification Council.

New law (R.S. 5081(B)(1)) instead requires any course taken with the award to be identified by the advisory council established in existing law (R.S. 17:3047.1).

New law applies to awards for the 2026-2027 school year and thereafter.

Effective upon signature of governor (June 8, 2025).
