Proposed law requires the Department of Public Safety and Corrections, Public Safety Services (DPS), Office of Motor Vehicles (OMV) to create the Conserve Louisiana specialty prestige license plate, provided there is a minimum of 1,000 applicants for such plates. Proposed law provides that OMV shall create the Conserve Louisiana special prestige license plates when OMV's electronic vehicle and title registration system is updated to accommodate the creation of new plates. Proposed law restricts the specialty license plate to passenger cars, pickup trucks, recreational vehicles, motorcycles, and vans. Proposed law provides that DPS shall design the plate in conjunction with the secretary of the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries and the plate shall include the words "Conserve Louisiana." Proposed law directs DPS to collect a \$50 annual royalty fee and forward the fee to the Louisiana Quail Forever and Ducks Unlimited. Proposed law authorizes DPS to collect a \$3.50 handling fee for each plate to be retained by DPS to offset a portion of administrative costs.

EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION

Proposed law will have an indeterminable, likely marginal, impact on state expenditures for the Department of Public Safety (DPS), Office of Motor Vehicles (OMV) to issue a special prestige license plate because of the inability of OMV's legacy system to create additional special prestige license plates at this time. Currently, OMV is unable to create new license plates on the legacy mainframe system, as it has reached maximum capacity.

In July 2025, OMV selected a new vendor, CHAMP Titles, to replace its old legacy mainframe system - vehicle services and driver services platforms. Once the vehicle services portion is completed in September 2027, OMV can begin issuing new special prestige license plates. If the proposed legislation becomes law, the department reports that any legislatively mandated changes will be made, when technologically possible, as part of the existing contract with CHAMP Titles/Drive 360 Solution. **Therefore, the proposed law is not likely to create a direct expenditure impact within the five-year horizon of this fiscal note as the vendor will make any legislatively mandated changes regarding prestige plates as part of the existing contract. However, there will be a marginal cost once the plate is issued based on historical costs.**

Historically, legislation issuing special prestige license plates results in an indeterminable, but likely marginal, increase in state expenditures for supplies associated with the manufacture of license plates. The proposed law will require \$4,320 in supply purchases to manufacture 1,000 "Conserve Louisiana" plates at a cost of \$4.32 per plate (\$4.32 x 1,000 = \$4,320). Each additional license plate would result in an expenditure increase of \$4.32. DPS is limited to collecting only \$3.50 for administrative costs; every 1,000 plates issued each fiscal year results in an expenditure of \$820 SGF.

REVENUE EXPLANATION

To the extent these plates are issued in the future, the proposed law may generate \$3,500 in self-generated revenue and statutory dedications for OMV for every 1,000 prestige plates that are issued. The proposed law authorizes OMV to charge a \$3.50 handling fee per license plate sold to offset a portion of administrative costs (\$3.50 x 1,000 plates = \$3,500). Proposed law may also generate \$50,000 in royalty fees at \$25 annually per plate for every 1,000 plates issued (\$25 per plate x 1,000 x 2 years). Fees are collected every two years upon renewal.

Proposed law may also generate \$100,000 in royalty fees at \$50 annually per plate for every 1,000 plates issued (\$50 per plate x 1,000 x 2 years). Fees are collected every two years upon renewal. Royalties collected are deposited into an escrow account and then would be forwarded to Conservation Fund.

For both the existing Louisiana Quail Forever (R.S.47:463.460 and Ducks Unlimited (R.S.47:463.53), there will be a projected indeterminable increase in funds sent to Louisiana Quail Forever and Louisiana Ducks Unlimited organizations. The Louisiana Quail Forever plates will increase in price from \$26 every two years to \$50 annually, with a \$34 increase in year one and \$50 per year in annual royalties the following years. The Ducks Unlimited plates will show a new recurring projected indeterminable increase of \$50 per year after year one.

In FY25, there were a total of 14 new and renewed Quail Forever plates and a total of 85 new and renewed Ducks Unlimited plates.
