Prohibits the administration of nonprescription medication to children without parental consent

Proposed law creates the crime of unlawful distribution of melatonin to children; provides that it is unlawful for any person to provide a child with a melatonin sleep aid without prior written consent of the child's parent or legal guardian; assesses a fine of no more than \$1,000 or imprisonment for no more than six months, or both, for those in violation.

EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION

Proposed law may result in an indeterminable increase in Local Funds expenditures for local governing authorities if a person is convicted of unlawful distribution of melatonin to children. Proposed law creates a misdemeanor criminal offense. The exact fiscal impact of this legislation to local governing authorities is indeterminable, since it is not known how many people will be convicted and incarcerated in local facilities, nor the length of sentences assessed with those convictions as a result of its potential enactment. The maximum imprisonment term at the local level is no more than six months.

There is no anticipated direct material effect on state governmental expenditures as a result of this measure because this legislation creates a misdemeanor offense; therefore, these offenders will not be sentenced to the Department of Public Safety & Corrections - Corrections Services (DPS&C-CS).

REVENUE EXPLANATION

Proposed law may result in an indeterminable increase in local revenues as a result of convictions of unlawful distribution of melatonin to children. The exact fiscal impact of the passage of this legislation on local revenue is indeterminable because the fines that would be imposed on those convicted (no more than \$1,000) are optional, and the amount of fines, if imposed, may vary. The potential revenue will accrue to the local governing authority.
