COMMUNITY SVSC OFFICE: Directs the Department of Social Services to create a Foster Care and Adoption Management report

1	A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION
2	To direct the office of community services within the Department of Social
3	Services to create a Foster Care and Adoption Management report
4	which shall delineate and compare certain foster care and adoption
5	information.
6	WHEREAS, the office of community services shall compile an annual
7	Foster Care and Adoption Management report in order to create more
8	awareness relative to activities of the office in the areas of foster care and
9	adoption; and
10	WHEREAS, the office of community services shall annually compile
11	a report detailing its activities in the areas of foster care and adoption and shall
12	compare its results to the activities of the previous year and to a five-year
13	running average; and
14	WHEREAS, the report shall include data for the entire state and for
15	each of the office's regional offices and shall be compiled and published by the
16	end of September for the preceding fiscal year ending on June thirtieth; and

1	WHEREAS, the published report shall be given to the governor, to each
2	state senator and state representative, the major daily newspapers, and network
3	television stations in the following cities: New Orleans, Baton Rouge,
4	Lafayette, Lake Charles, Alexandria, Monroe, and Shreveport; and
5	WHEREAS, the report shall include information on all new or existing
6	programs relative to recruitment of new foster or adoptive homes and all
7	activities intended to improve the rate of placement of children in adoptive
8	homes.
9	THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana
10	does hereby direct the office of community services to annually compile a
11	Foster Care and Adoption Management report detailing its activities in the
12	areas of foster care and adoption and to create greater awareness by the
13	governor, the legislature, and the public of the activities of the office and its
14	capacity to fulfill its obligations relative to foster care and adoption.
15	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that each report shall include complete
16	data on each of the following categories:
17	(1) Number of children in state custody as of year end.
18	(2) Number of children taken into state custody.
19	(3) Number of children leaving state custody.
20	(4) Number of children adopted out of state custody.
21	(5) Number of children reunited with birth family out of state custody.
22	(6) Number of children leaving foster care due to age.
23	(7) Number of cases in which parental rights were terminated.
24	(8) Number of cases in which termination of rights was by court action.
25	(9) Number of cases in which the office has sought termination of
26	rights by court action.
27	(10) Number of cases in which the child has been in state custody for
28	longer than seventeen months where the office has not sought termination of

1	rights by court action, when such data becomes available through an automated
2	child welfare tracking system.
3	(11) Number of cases in which adoption is not a part of the plan for the
4	child.
5	(12) Number of children freed for adoption and awaiting placement.
6	(13) Average number of months in state custody for all children who
7	left custody during the year.
8	(14) New foster care homes opened.
9	(15) Foster care homes housing more than four children in state
10	custody.
11	(16) Number of children housed in hospitals or institutions.
12	(17) New foster and adoptive homes opened.
13	(18) Average number of cases assigned to each foster care case
14	manager.
15	(19) Average number of cases assigned to each adoption case manager.
16	(20) Number of children entering foster care by reasons for entering
17	foster care.
18	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that for each category of the report,
19	data shall be included for each of the following age groups:
20	(1) Infants (ages 0-1)
21	(2) Young children (ages 2-4)
22	(3) Older children (ages 5-9)
23	(4) Preadolescents and adolescents (ages 10-17)
24	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a suitable copy of this Resolution
25	be transmitted to Carmen D. Weisner, assistant secretary of the Louisiana
26	office of community services within the Louisiana Department of Social
27	Services.

Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

Committee Amendments Proposed by <u>House Committee on Health and</u> <u>Welfare</u> to the <u>original</u> resolution.

- 1. Requires the report to be compiled and published by the end of September for the preceding fiscal year ending on June 30.
- 2. Adds the number of children entering foster care by reasons therefor to the list of data that the office must compile.

House Floor Amendments to the engrossed resolution.

1. Clarifies that the resolution does not create an Act, but instead provides that the office of community services shall compile certain information, which shall be called the Foster Care and Adoption Management report.
