SUMMARY OF HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO THE SENATE BILL

- 1. Removes provisions setting salaries as a percentage of the salary for members of the United States Congress and sets salaries at specific dollar amounts.
- 2. Adds provisions for percentage salary adjustments, beginning July 1, 2009, based on the percentage increase in the Consumer Price Index for all urban consumers (CPI-U)

DIGEST OF THE SENATE BILL AS RETURNED TO THE SENATE

DIGEST

Duplessis (SB 672)

<u>Present law</u> provides that in addition to per diem and all other allowances, members of the legislature shall be paid an annual salary of \$16,800. <u>Proposed law</u> increases the annual salary for members of the legislature to \$37,500.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides an annual salary of \$54,750 for the chairmen of the following legislative committees: the Senate Committee on Finance; the Senate Committee on Revenue and Fiscal Affairs; the House Committee on Appropriations; and the House Committee on Ways and Means.

<u>Proposed law</u> increases the annual salary for the president of the Senate and the speaker of the House of Representatives <u>from</u> \$32,000 to \$71,250.

<u>Proposed law</u> increases the annual salary for the president pro tempore of the Senate and the speaker pro tempore of the House of Representatives <u>from</u> \$24,500 to \$54,750.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides for the salary adjustments under <u>proposed law</u> if there is an increase in the Consumer Price Index for all urban consumers (CPI-U). Provides that, beginning July 1, 2009, the percentage of any salary adjustment be the same percentage as any increase in the CPI-U prepared by the U. S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics for the preceding calendar year.

Effective July 1, 2008.
