PURPOSE OF BILL:

INDIAN AFFAIRS. Recognizes Four Winds Tribe, Louisiana Cherokee Confederacy as an Indian tribe.

This legislation provides that the Legislature formally recognize the Four Winds Tribe, Louisiana Cherokee Confederacy. This legislation requires the Four Winds Tribe to agree not to apply for any gaming license or permit. State recognition of an Indian tribe does not obligate the state to expend any funds; however, the federal Bureau of Indian Affairs requires State recognition in order for an Indian tribe to receive federal recognition.


EXPENDITURES:
