HOUSE BILL NO. 1238

MUSEUMS/STATE MUSEUM: Provides with respect to the Germantown Colony Museum

1 AN ACT

2 To amend and reenact R.S. 25:380.152(C)(1), relative to the governing board of the  
3 Germantown Colony Museum; to provide relative to board membership; and to  
4 provide for related matters.

5 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

6 Section 1. R.S. 25:380.152(C)(1) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as  
7 follows:

8 §380.152. Governing board; creation; domicile; appointment and compensation of  
9 members

10 \* \* \*

11 C. The board shall be comprised of the following members:

12 (1) ~~Eight~~ Ten members who have a knowledge of and an interest in the  
13 purposes of the museum shall be appointed by the secretary of state to serve  
14 four-year terms concurrent with the governor.

15 \* \* \*

16 Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not  
17 signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature  
18 by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If  
19 vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become  
20 effective on the day following such approval.

**Abstract:** Changes the membership of the governing board of the Germantown Colony Museum in Webster Parish from eight members to 10 members.

Present law creates the Germantown Colony Museum in Webster Parish and places the museum in the Dept. of State.

Present law provides for eight members on the governing board of the Germantown Colony Museum, which are appointed by the secretary of state.

Proposed law provides instead for 10 members on the governing board of the museum; the additional members are also appointed by the secretary of state.

Present law, retained by proposed law, provides that the secretary of state or his designee is an ex officio member of the board.

Effective upon signature of governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
