# SCHOOLS/DISTRICTS: Requests that BESE and the Recovery School District study jointly the feasibility of building a high school at the site of the former Alfred Lawless High School in the Lower Ninth Ward of New Orleans

1	A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION
2	To urge and request the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education and the
3	Recovery School District to study jointly the feasibility of building a high school at
4	the site of the former Alfred Lawless High School in the Lower Ninth Ward of the
5	city of New Orleans and to submit jointly a written report of findings and
6	recommendations to the House Committee on Education and the Senate Committee
7	on Education not later than sixty days prior to beginning of the 2012 Regular Session
8	of the Legislature.
9	WHEREAS, Alfred Lawless High School, known also as Lawless High School, was
10	located in the 5300 block of Law Street in the Lower Ninth Ward of New Orleans, just a few
11	blocks from one of the levee breaches during Hurricane Katrina along the Industrial Canal;
12	and
13	WHEREAS, Lawless High School suffered catastrophic damage in Hurricane
14	Katrina, and after the Federal Emergency Management Agency deemed it sufficiently
15	damaged, the school was demolished; and
16	WHEREAS, many residents of the Lower Ninth Ward were devastated by the razing
17	of the school, which was a true neighborhood institution and was deeply beloved by its
18	students, faculty, staff, and alumni and by the community as a whole; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Lawless High School opened in the early 1960s and served grades eight 2 through twelve, and before Hurricane Katrina, it served approximately eight hundred 3 students; and 4 WHEREAS, building a school, viewed by many as the cornerstone of a community, 5 certainly would reinforce this unique neighborhood's passionate and steadfast revitalization 6 efforts; and 7 WHEREAS, in addition to meeting the educational needs of the community, building 8 a high school at this historic site would serve as a welcome and hopeful example of the 9 ongoing restoration and rebuilding that is possible throughout the Lower Ninth Ward, the 10 city of New Orleans, and all hurricane-affected areas in Louisiana; and 11 WHEREAS, there is both a strong need and strong community support for the 12 building of a high school in this neighborhood; and 13 WHEREAS, it is appropriate and necessary that the feasibility of building a high 14 school at the site of the former Alfred Lawless High School receive a thorough examination. 15 THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby 16 urge and request the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education and the Recovery 17 School District to study jointly the feasibility of building a high school at the site of the 18 former Alfred Lawless High School in the Lower Ninth Ward of the city of New Orleans and 19 to submit jointly, in compliance with R.S. 24:771 and 772, a written report of findings and 20 recommendations to the House Committee on Education and the Senate Committee on 21 Education not later than sixty days prior to the beginning of the 2012 Regular Session of the 22 Legislature. 23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a suitable copy of this Resolution be transmitted 24 to the president of the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education, to the
- 25 superintendent of the Recovery School District, and to the state superintendent of education.
