DIGEST

Morrish (SB 23)

<u>Present law</u> provides that no person born after Jan. 1, 1984, can operate a motorboat powered by a motor in excess of 10 horsepower unless he has successfully completed a boating safety class approved by the National Association of State Boating Law Administrators. Further provides that a person who has completed an approved boating safety class must be in possession of evidence of such completion when operating such a boat.

<u>Proposed law</u> exempts from <u>present law</u> a person who is licensed by the United States Coast Guard as a captain to operate a vessel.

Effective upon signature of the governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.

Summary of Amendments Adopted by Senate

<u>Committee Amendments Proposed by Senate Committee on Commerce, Consumer Protection, and International Affairs to the original bill.</u>

1. Changes the individual who is exempt <u>from</u> a Coast Guard licensed master of a vessel <u>to</u> a person licensed by the Coast Guard as a captain to operate a vessel.
