DIGEST

Mills (SB 60)

<u>Present law</u> allows a pharmacist to administer the influenza vaccination to any person seven years of age or older.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> but expands the types of vaccinations which can be administered by a pharmacist to persons 18 years of age or older to include the following:

- (1) Pneumococcal
- (2) Zoster
- (3) Tetanus and Diphtheria Toxoids Adsorbed for Adult Use (Td)
- (4) Tetanus Toxoid, Reduced Diphtheria Toxoid and Acellular Pertussis Vaccine Adsorbed (Tdap)

Effective August 15, 2011.

(Amends R.S. 37:1218)

Summary of Amendments Adopted by Senate

Committee Amendments Proposed by Senate Committee on Health and Welfare to the original bill.

- 1. Adds provision which requires the administration of immunizations by a pharmacist to be in conformance with guidance published in the Louisiana State Immunization Manual.
- 2. Changes the age at which the pharmacist may administer a vaccine for Pneumococcal, Zoster, Tetanus and Diphtheria Toxoids Adsorbed for Adult Use (Td), and Tetanus Toxoid, Reduced Diphtheria Toxoid and Acellular Pertussis Vaccine Adsorbed (Tdap) to a person without prescription or medical order <u>from 7 to 18</u> years of age.
- 3. Technical amendments
