HOMELAND SECURITY: Provides relative to the creation of a statewide planning and mapping system for public buildings

AN ACT

| 2  | To enact R.S. 29:726.3, relative to the Louisiana Homeland Security and Emergency     |
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| 3  | Assistance and Disaster Act; to provide for the development, operation, and           |
| 4  | maintenance of a critical incident planning and mapping system; to provide for        |
| 5  | responsibilities of the Governor's Office of Homeland Security and Emergency          |
| 6  | Preparedness; to require that certain entities provide critical information to be     |
| 7  | included in the system; to provide definitions; and to provide for related matters.   |
| 8  | Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:  |
| 9  | Section 1. R.S. 29:726.3 is hereby enacted to read as follows:                        |
| 0  | §726.3. Critical Incident Planning and Mapping System                                 |
| 1  | A. To the extent that sufficient funds are appropriated to implement the              |
| 12 | provisions of this Section, the Governor's Office of Homeland Security and            |
| 13 | Emergency Preparedness shall develop, operate, and maintain a statewide critical      |
| 14 | incident planning and mapping system for all public buildings in this state to assist |
| 15 | first responders when responding to a disaster or emergency.                          |
| 16 | B. The Governor's Office of Homeland Security and Emergency                           |
| 17 | Preparedness shall create, develop, or acquire a computer system and software that    |
| 18 | has the capability to do the following:   |
| 19 | (1) Store critical information as provided in Subsection C of this Section.           |

| 1  | (2) Provide access to the critical information contained in the system to all           |
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| 2  | first responders.   |
| 3  | C.(1) To the extent that sufficient funds are available to implement the                |
| 4  | provisions of this Section, the office of facility planning and control, division of    |
| 5  | administration, the governing authority of each local governmental subdivision, and     |
| 6  | the superintendent of each local school district shall provide to the Governor's Office |
| 7  | of Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness for inclusion in the system the         |
| 8  | following critical information for all public buildings located in this state:          |
| 9  | (a) Building floor plans.   |
| 10 | (b) Evacuation plans and other fire protection information relative to each             |
| 11 | state building.   |
| 12 | (c) Any known hazards associated with the building.                                     |
| 13 | (2) The information required by the provisions of Paragraph (1) of this                 |
| 14 | Subsection shall be available to first responders to assist in the determination of the |
| 15 | best approach when responding to an emergency or disaster, including but not            |
| 16 | limited to the determination of evacuation routes and strategies for evacuation,        |
| 17 | alarms and other signals or means of notification, plans for sheltering in place, and   |
| 18 | training and strategies for the prevention of attacks involving violence.               |
| 19 | D. The Governor's Office of Homeland Security and Emergency                             |
| 20 | Preparedness shall adopt rules in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act      |
| 21 | to implement the provisions of this Section. The rules shall provide for the            |
| 22 | following:  |
| 23 | (1) The manner by which the critical information required by the provisions             |
| 24 | of Subsection C of this Section shall be transferred to the system from the office of   |
| 25 | facility planning and control, division of administration, the governing authority of   |
| 26 | local governmental subdivisions, and school superintendents.                            |
| 27 | (2) The format by which those entities shall transfer critical information for          |
| 28 | inclusion in the system.  |

| 1  | (3) The standards and conditions for the use of the system by first                           |
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| 2  | responders.   |
| 3  | (4) The guidelines for the accessibility and confidentiality of information                   |
| 4  | contained within the system.  |
| 5  | (5) A list of the priorities for the distribution of any funds which may be                   |
| 6  | available to the entities eligible to participate in the system.                              |
| 7  | (6) The guidelines for the training of persons on how to utilize the system.                  |
| 8  | E. The Governor's Office of Homeland Security and Emergency                                   |
| 9  | Preparedness shall take such actions as are necessary and appropriate to secure               |
| 10 | private, state, federal, or other public funds for the development, operation, and            |
| 11 | maintenance of the statewide critical incident mapping and planning system. The               |
| 12 | Governor's Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness may accept                  |
| 13 | gifts, grants, and other contributions for the development, operation, and                    |
| 14 | maintenance of the system.  |
| 15 | F. Beginning on the first day of October 2011, the Governor's Office of                       |
| 16 | Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness shall provide to the legislature an              |
| 17 | annual report setting forth the progress of developing, operating, and maintaining the        |
| 18 | system.   |
| 19 | G. For purposes of this Section:  |
| 20 | (1) "Political subdivision" means any parish, city, town, village, special                    |
| 21 | district, or school district.   |
| 22 | (2) "Public building" means any building used or owned by the state or any                    |
| 23 | political subdivision of the state and shall include any building used by any public          |
| 24 | elementary and secondary school, college, or university.                                      |
| 25 | Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not          |
| 26 | signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature |
| 27 | by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If  |
| 28 | vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become    |
| 29 | effective on the day following such approval.   |

**Abstract:** Authorizes the creation of a statewide planning and mapping system for public buildings to assist first responders in a disaster or emergency.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the Governor's Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness (GOHSEP) to create a statewide critical incident planning and mapping system for all public buildings in this state to assist first responders when responding to a disaster or emergency. Requires GOHSEP to acquire a computer system and software that has the capability of storing critical information required by <u>proposed law</u> and grant access to that information to all first responders.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires that certain entities provide critical information to GOHSEP for inclusion in the system and provides for the use of critical information by first responders.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires GOHSEP to adopt rules in accordance with the APA to implement <u>proposed law</u> and provides that <u>proposed law</u> is contingent upon the appropriation of funds.

Effective upon signature of governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
