HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 97

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

To urge and request the Louisiana Wildlife and Fisheries Commission to study the creel

limits on freshwater fish established in its fishing rules and regulations.

WHEREAS, Article IX, Section 1 of the Constitution of Louisiana states "The

natural resources of the state, including air and water, and the healthful, scenic, historic, and

esthetic quality of the environment shall be protected, conserved, and replenished insofar as

possible and consistent with the health, safety, and welfare of the people." and Article IX,

Section 7 provides "The control and supervision of the wildlife of the state, including all

aquatic life, is vested in the Louisiana Wildlife and Fisheries Commission."; and

WHEREAS, a part of controlling and supervising the wildlife of the state in a manner

to protect, preserve, and replenish is to study the impacts of fishing, including the impacts

of certain creel limits; and

WHEREAS, setting those creel limits should be done only after careful study of the

sustainability of the many freshwater species fished in this state, the health of the species

present in the state, the quality of the habitat necessary to sustain the species, the practices

of other states in setting creel limits and the experience other states have had with the

impacts of their creel limits.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby

urge and request the Louisiana Wildlife and Fisheries Commission to study the creel limits

on freshwater fish established in its rules and regulations relative to fishing.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be forwarded to the

chairman of the Louisiana Wildlife and Fisheries Commission.
