1 AN ACT

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To amend and reenact R.S. 30:2506(A)(introductory paragraph) and (B), 2507(A), and 2532(A)(4) and (B)(1), R.S. 32:412(A)(1), (2), (5), and (6), (B)(1), (2), and (7)(e)(i)(aa), (cc), (dd)(I), and (ee) and (ii)(aa), (cc), (dd)(I), and (ee), R.S. 36:605(B)(4)(a), and R.S. 47:463.43(A), (D), and (E), to enact R.S. 56:10(B)(15), and to repeal R.S. 30:2504, 2511, and 2532(C) and (D), R.S. 36:609(B)(4), Section 3 of Act No. 527 of the 2003 Regular Session of the Legislature, Act No. 363 of the 2004 Regular Session of the Legislature, Act No. 190 of the 2007 Regular Session of the Legislature, and R.S. 32:412(A)(1), (2), (5), (6), (B)(1), (2), (7)(e)(i)(aa), (dd)(I), (e)(ii)(aa), and (dd)(I) as amended by Act No. 9 of the 2011 First Extraordinary Session of the Legislature, relative to litter abatement, enforcement, and education; to provide for the Louisiana Environmental Education Commission; to provide for the responsibility and duties of the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries; to provide litter abatement and enforcement; to create the litter abatement and education account; to provide for the deposit of certain fines into the litter abatement and education account; to provide for education programs; to abolish the environmental education division within the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries; to provide for special license plates; to provide for the disposition of certain funds collected from driver's license issuance and renewal and special license plates; and to provide for related matters.

2	Section 1. R.S. 30:2506(A)(introductory paragraph) and (B), 2507(A), and
3	2532(A)(4) and (B)(1) are hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:
4	§2506. Curriculum framework
5	A. The commission and the environmental education division shall work
6	with the Department of Education to develop a curriculum framework for
7	establishing environmental education programs in all public and private elementary
8	and secondary schools. The program shall integrate environmental concepts and

21	§2532. Collection and distribution of fines; Keep Louisiana Beautiful Fund litter

23	A. All fines collected under the provisions of this Part shall be payable as
24	follows:

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(4) The remainder shall be paid to the state treasury for credit to the Keep Louisiana Beautiful Fund litter abatement and education account.

B.(1) All other monies received under the provisions of this Part shall be paid into the state treasury on or before the twenty-fifth day of each month following their collection and, in accordance with Article VII, Section 9 of the Constitution of

Louisiana, shall be credited to the Bond Security and Redemption Fund. Out of the funds remaining in the Bond Security and Redemption Fund after a sufficient amount is allocated therefrom to pay all obligations secured by the full faith and credit of the state which become due and payable within each fiscal year, the treasurer shall pay an amount equal to the total amount of such funds collected or received under the provisions of this Part paid into the treasury into a special fund which is hereby created in the state treasury and designated as the Keep Louisiana Beautiful Fund for administration by the Department of Environmental Quality. The secretary shall administer the Keep Louisiana Beautiful Fund and shall make disbursements from the fund for the necessary and appropriate operating expenses of the section litter abatement and education account.

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Section 2. R.S. 32:412(A)(1), (2), (5), and (6), (B)(1), (2), and (7)(e)(i)(aa), (cc), (dd)(I), and (ee) and (ii)(aa), (cc), (dd)(I), and (ee) are hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

§412. Amount of fees; credit or refund; duration of license; disbursement of funds; renewal by mail or electronic commerce of Class "D" or "E" drivers' licenses; disposition of certain fees; exception

A.(1) Every applicant for a Class "D" driver's license, or for a renewal of a Class "D" driver's license, except those bona fide residents of cities having a population in excess of four hundred fifty thousand the city of New Orleans, shall pay for such basic license a fee of twenty-eight dollars and fifty cents. Seven dollars and forty-three cents of the fee shall be paid to the State Police Pension and Retirement Fund. One dollar of the fee shall be forwarded by the department to the environmental education division within the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries, office of wildlife litter abatement and education account which is created within the Conservation Fund through the provisions of R.S. 56:10(B)(15).

(2) The fee for Class "D" drivers' driver's licenses, or renewal of a Class "D" driver's license, issued to bona fide residents of municipalities having a population in excess of four hundred fifty thousand the city of New Orleans shall be thirty-six

dollars, ten dollars of which fee shall be payable by the department to the board of trustees of the police pension fund of such municipalities the city of New Orleans. One dollar and twenty-three cents of the fee shall be paid to the State Police Pension and Retirement Fund. One dollar of the fee shall be forwarded by the department to the environmental education division within the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries, office of wildlife litter abatement and education account which is created within the Conservation Fund through the provisions of R.S. 56:10(B)(15).

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(5) Every applicant for a Class "E" driver's license, or for a renewal of a Class "E" driver's license, except those bona fide residents of cities having a population in excess of four hundred fifty thousand the city of New Orleans, shall pay for such basic license a fee of thirteen dollars and fifty cents, which shall be the cost of such basic license. Three dollars and seventy-five cents of the fee shall be paid to the State Police Pension and Retirement Fund. One dollar of the fee shall be forwarded by the department to the environmental education division within the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries, office of wildlife litter abatement and education account which is created within the Conservation Fund through the provisions of R.S. 56:10(B)(15).

(6) The fee for a Class "E" driver's license, or renewal of a Class "E" driver's license, issued to bona fide residents of municipalities having a population in excess of four hundred fifty thousand the city of New Orleans shall be thirteen dollars and fifty cents, two dollars and fifty cents of which fee shall be paid by the department to the board of trustees of the police pension funds of such municipalities the city of New Orleans. Two dollars and fifty cents of the fee shall be paid to the State Police Pension and Retirement Fund. One dollar of the fee shall be forwarded by the department to the environmental education division within the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries, office of wildlife litter abatement and education account which is created within the Conservation Fund through the provisions of R.S. 56:10(B)(15).

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B.(1) Every applicant for a Class "A", "B", or "C" commercial driver's
license, or for a renewal of a basic Class "A", "B", or "C" commercial driver's
license, except for those bona fide residents of cities having a population in excess
of four hundred fifty thousand the city of New Orleans, shall pay for such basic
license a fee of forty-one dollars. Ten dollars and eighty cents of the fee shall be
paid to the State Police Pension and Retirement Fund. One dollar of the fee shall
be forwarded by the department to the environmental education division within the
Department of Wildlife and Fisheries, office of wildlife litter abatement and
education account which is created within the Conservation Fund through the
provisions of R.S. 56:10(B)(15).

(2) The fee for a basic Class "A", "B", or "C" commercial driver's license, or for the renewal of a basic Class "A", "B", or "C" commercial driver's license, issued to bona fide residents of municipalities having a population in excess of four hundred fifty thousand the city of New Orleans shall be fifty-one dollars, ten dollars of which fee shall be paid by the department to the board of trustees of the police pension fund of such municipalities the city of New Orleans. Ten dollars of the fee shall be paid to the State Police Pension and Retirement Fund. One dollar of the fee shall be forwarded by the department to the environmental education division within the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries, office of wildlife litter abatement and education account which is created within the Conservation Fund through the provisions of R.S. 56:10(B)(15).

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(e)(i)(aa) Every applicant seventy years of age or older for a Class "E" driver's license, or for the renewal of a Class "E" driver's license, except those bona fide residents of cities having a population in excess of four hundred fifty thousand the city of New Orleans, shall pay for such basic license a fee of four dollars and fifty cents, which shall be the cost of the license. The license shall expire on the

anniversary of the birthday of the applicant which is nearest to a date of four years subsequent to the issuing of the license, unless revoked, canceled, or suspended.

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(cc) Fifty cents of the fee shall be paid to the office of state police. One dollar and fifty cents of the fee shall be paid to the State Police Pension and Retirement Fund. One dollar of the fee shall be forwarded by the department to the environmental education division within the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries, office of wildlife litter abatement and education account which is created within the Conservation Fund through the provisions of R.S. 56:10(B)(15).

(dd)(I) Every applicant seventy years of age or older for a Class "D" driver's license, or for the renewal of a Class "D" driver's license, except those bona fide residents of cities having a population in excess of four hundred fifty thousand the city of New Orleans, shall pay for such basic license a fee of fourteen dollars and seventy-five cents, which shall be the cost of the license. The license shall expire on the anniversary of the birthday of the applicant which is nearest to the date of four years subsequent to the issuing of the license, unless revoked, canceled, or suspended.

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(ee) Three dollars and seventy-one cents of the fee shall be paid to the State Police Pension and Retirement Fund. One dollar of the fee shall be forwarded by the department to the environmental education division within the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries, office of wildlife litter abatement and education account which is created within the Conservation Fund through the provisions of R.S. 56:10(B)(15).

(ii)(aa) Every applicant seventy years of age or older for a Class "E" driver's license, or for the renewal of a Class "E" driver's license, issued to bona fide residents of cities having a population in excess of four hundred fifty thousand the city of New Orleans, shall pay for such basic license a fee of four dollars and fifty cents, which shall be the cost of the license. This license shall expire on the

2	subsequent to the issuing of the license, unless revoked, canceled, or suspended.

4	(cc) One dollar of the fee shall be paid to the Board of Trustees of the Police
5	Pension Fund of said municipalities the city of New Orleans. One dollar of the fee
6	shall be paid to the State Police Pension and Retirement Fund. One dollar of the fee
7	shall be forwarded by the department to the environmental education division within
8	the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries, office of wildlife litter abatement and
9	education account which is created within the Conservation Fund through the

11	(dd)(I) Every applicant seventy years of age or older for a Class "D" driver's
12	license, or for the renewal of a Class "D" driver's license, issued to bona fide
13	residents of cities having a population in excess of four hundred fifty thousand the
14	city of New Orleans, shall pay for such basic license a fee of eighteen dollars and
15	fifty cents, which shall be the cost of the license. This license shall expire on the
16	anniversary of the birthday of the applicant which is nearest to the date of four years
17	subsequent to the issuing of the license, unless revoked, canceled, or suspended.

19	(ee) Five dollars of the fee shall be payable by the department to the board
20	of trustees of the police pension fund of such municipalities the city of New Orleans.
21	Sixty-one cents of the fee shall be paid to the State Police Pension and Retirement
22	Fund. One dollar of the fee shall be forwarded by the department to the

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Section 3. R.S. 36:605(B)(4)(a) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows: §605. Powers and duties of the secretary of wildlife and fisheries

Conservation Fund through the provisions of R.S. 56:10(B)(15).

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B.	The	secretary	shall	have	authority	to
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(4)(a) Enforce the laws of the state and rules and regulations relative to wildlife and fisheries, including but not limited to laws, rules, and regulations relative to illegal hunting, fishing, and trapping, boating safety regulations, and the prohibited methods, times, or seasons, and locations therefor, including the illegal transportation, shipping, and sale of wildlife, fish, and other aquatic life and furbearing animals and alligators, and including the illegal possession of wildlife, game, or fish and other aquatic life, and develop and implement litter abatement, enforcement, and awareness programs and toward these ends shall appoint not less than twenty-five wildlife agents, whose entire time, under the direction of the secretary, shall be devoted to the performance of their official duties as prescribed by law. Notwithstanding R.S. 40:5, the secretary shall have authority to enforce the laws specifically assigned by statute to the Department of Health and Hospitals and any rules or regulations promulgated thereunder for the purpose of regulating the harvesting, processing, or distribution of molluscan shellfish.

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Section 4. R.S. 47:463.43(A), (D), and (E) are hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

§463.43. Special license plates; environmental education division

A. The Department of Public Safety and Corrections shall establish a special prestige motor vehicle license plate for the environmental education division within by the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries, office of wildlife, R.S. 30:2503 et seq for the purposes provided in R.S. 56:10(B)(15). The license plates shall be restricted to use on passenger cars, pickup trucks, vans, and recreational vehicles.

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D. The department shall collect the donation for each license plate and forward the donation as provided in Subsection C of this Section to the environmental education division Department of Wildlife and Fisheries. The one dollar handling fee as provided in Subsection C of this Section shall be retained by

the department to offset the administrative costs. The funds received by the environmental education division Department of Wildlife and Fisheries office of wildlife pursuant to this Section shall be deposited in the Louisiana Environmental Education Fund, R.S. 30:2511 litter abatement and education account which is created within the Conservation Fund through the provisions of R.S. 56:10(B)(15), and used solely for the purposes of that fund.

E. The secretary with the assistance of the environmental education division shall establish such rules and regulations as are necessary to implement the provisions of this Section, including but not limited to rules and regulations governing the collection and disbursement of the donation, the transfer and disposition of such license plates, the colors available, and the design criteria. The design shall include the use of the environmental education division logo.

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Section 5. R.S. 56:10(B)(15) is hereby enacted to read as follows:

§10. Annual report to governor; estimate of proposed expenditures; particular funds; warrants; vouchers; surplus funds

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known as the "litter abatement and education account" which shall consist of all revenue collected from the sale of the environmental education license plate provided for in R.S. 47:463.43; all revenue received from the Department of Public Safety and Corrections, office of motor vehicles, pursuant to R.S. 32:412(A)(1); funds from public or private donations and any other source which may specify deposit to this account; and any remaining balance in the Louisiana Environmental Education Fund as of August 15, 2011. The revenues shall be subject to the same requirements as provided for other revenues placed in the Conservation Fund in Paragraph (1) of this Subsection. The funds in this account shall be used solely for litter abatement and enforcement; public service announcements; develop, review,

approve, and implement a plan for statewide environmental education; for the training of operators of vehicles regarding littering; to finance local littering enforcement activities in order to promote public safety, order, and general welfare by making the streets, roads, rivers, streams, bayous, lakes, waterways, and highways of Louisiana clean, safe, and free of debris, litter, and other material falling from or being thrown from vehicles; and to award grants to nonprofit organizations and public agencies for the development, dissemination, and assessment of such education programs.

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Section 6. R.S. 30:2504 and 2511 and R.S. 36:609(B)(4) and Section 3 of Act No. 527 of the 2003 Regular Session of the Legislature, Act No. 363 of the 2004 Regular Session of the Legislature, Act No.190 of the 2007 Regular Session of the Legislature, R.S. 30:2532(C) and (D), and R.S. 32:412(A)(1), (2), (5), (6), (B)(1), (2), (7)(e)(i)(aa), (dd)(I), (e)(ii)(aa), and (dd)(I) as amended by Act No. 9 of the 2011 First Extraordinary Session of the Legislature are hereby repealed in their entirety.

Section 7. This Act shall become effective on July 1, 2011; if vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become effective on July 1, 2011, or on the day following such approval by the legislature, whichever is later.
