## **DIGEST**

<u>Present law</u> in Code of Civil Procedure provides relative to small tutorships.

<u>Present law</u> provides that a small tutorship is the tutorship of a minor whose property in Louisiana has gross value of \$20,000 or less. <u>Proposed law</u> changes \$20,000 to \$50,000.

<u>Present law</u> provides the court may dispense with the furnishing of security by a legal tutor appointed in a proceeding under the <u>present law</u>. Further provides that if the court is satisfied that no one will accept the dative tutorship of a minor in a proceeding under the <u>present law</u> and furnish the usual security, if required, it shall appoint a dative tutor, who shall comply with all requirements except that of furnishing security. <u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and adds that the court may also dispense with the appointment of an undertutor.

<u>Present law</u> provides that court costs in proceedings under the <u>present law</u> shall be one-half the court costs in similar proceedings in larger tutorships, provided that the minimum costs in any case shall be \$5. <u>Proposed law</u> changes \$5 to \$100.

Effective upon signature of the governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
