<u>Present law</u> authorizes the legislature to express the intended meaning of a law in a duly adopted concurrent resolution, by the same vote and, except for gubernatorial veto and time limitations for introduction, according to the same procedures and formalities required for enactment of that law.

<u>Present law</u> was enacted pursuant to Act No. 725 of the 2004 Regular Session, provides that an elected public official who is a member of a governing authority of a parish who was elected to his initial term in 2004, may engage in any business activity with a licensee if he is a non-key gaming employee, if such employment commenced at least four years prior to holding elective public office. <u>Present law</u> further provides that an elected public official who is a member of a school board who took his oath of office for his initial term in 2004, may engage in any business activity with a licensee if he is a non-key gaming employee, if such employment commenced at least four years prior to holding elective public office. <u>Present law</u> further provides that an elected public official who is a member of a school board who took his oath of office for his initial term in 2004, may engage in any business activity with a licensee if he is a non-key gaming employee, if such employment commenced at least two years prior to Aug. 1, 2004.

<u>Proposed resolution</u> expresses the intent of the legislature regarding the meaning of "a licensee" to mean a licensee who is either the original or subsequent employer of the non-key gaming employee.
