Permits use of TOPS awards at eligible La. institutions by otherwise qualified students who graduated from out-of-state colleges or universities

Proposed law allows a student who enrolls as a full-time student in an out-of-state college or university and graduates from the out-of-state college or university to use a TOPS program award to pursue a postgraduate academic degree at an eligible institution in La. if the student meets all TOPS continuation requirements while in graduate school and meets the following conditions: (1) The student meets the initial eligibility requirements for a TOPS award. (2) The student graduated from an accredited out-of-state college or university. (3) While enrolled in an out-of-state college or university, the student met all requirements that would have been applicable to TOPS students in La. (4) The student graduated from high school during the 08-09 school year or thereafter. The tuition award shall be the lesser of the tuition charged for the postgraduate study or the tuition charged by the highest cost public college university in the state. Permits student to receive the award for 8 semesters as authorized by present law, as reduced pursuant to present law. **Proposed amendment excludes law degrees offered by law schools in the state.** Effective upon governor's signature.

EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION

State general fund expenditures for TOPS awards will increase by indeterminable, but likely significant amounts. The Louisiana Student Financial Assistance Commission (LOSFA) estimated that TOPS expenditures will increase by the following amounts per year due to the proposed legislation: FY14 \$713,000, FY15 \$1,426,000, FY16 \$1,782,000, FY17 and thereafter \$2,138,000. The amounts increase each year through the first four years as a new cohort of students receives TOPS awards. These additional TOPS expenditures are based on the following assumptions developed by LOSFA: 1) 1,540 students not accepting a TOPS award each year, 2) 10% of the 1,540 students (154 students) each year will return to Louisiana and pursue graduate study funded with a TOPS award, 3) Half of returning students (77 students) each year will pursue a two year graduate study program and the remaining half of returning students (77 students) each year will pursue a four year graduate study program, 4) \$5,183 in TOPS awards per year per student, 5) There will be no attrition of students participating in the TOPS program, and 6) No tuition increases, 7) Per the proposed amendment, the percentage of returning students who would pursue an advanced degree (excluding law) would be equal to the percentage of graduate students (excluding law) attending public postsecondary institutions (89.3%).

Note: These estimated TOPS expenditure increases are based on the assumptions stated above developed by LOSFA. The actual impact on TOPS expenditures could be significantly less than or greater than the estimates provided above.

REVENUE EXPLANATION

There is no anticipated direct material effect on governmental revenues as a result of this measure.
