

Subject: First and second conviction of domestic abuse battery

CRIME/ABUSE

OR INCREASE GF EX See Note Increases the maximum term of imprisonment for a first and second conviction of domestic abuse battery

Present law provides for the following penalties for the crime of domestic abuse battery:

(1) First conviction - fined not less than \$300 nor more than \$1,000 and imprisoned for not less than 30 days nor more than six months

(2) Second conviction - fined not less than \$750 nor more than \$1,000 and imprisoned for not less than 60 days nor more than six months

Proposed law increases the maximum term of imprisonment for a first and second conviction from six months to one year.

EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION

The proposed legislation may result in an indeterminable increase in state general fund expenditures if a defendant is sentenced to the maximum term of imprisonment for a first or second conviction of domestic abuse battery. The exact fiscal impact of the passage of this legislation is indeterminable, since it is not known how many individuals will be convicted of the crime. However, any offender sentenced to the custody of the Department of Public Safety and Corrections increases expenditures by \$24.39 per day per offender in local facilities. Therefore, for any offender convicted of this crime, it would cost the state \$8,902 annually (1 offender x \$24.39 per day x 365 days).

To the extent that offenders are housed in state facilities, the cost per day per offender is \$47.74. Therefore, for any offender convicted of this crime, it would cost the state \$17,425 annually (1 offender x \$47.74 per day x 365 days).

Currently, there are 82 offenders within state or local facilities for the crime of domestic abuse battery.

REVENUE EXPLANATION

There is no anticipated direct material effect on governmental revenues as a result of this measure.
