### PART I. FEED, FERTILIZER, AND AGRICULTURAL LIMING

#### **CHEMISTRY AND SEED COMMISSION**

19 §1381. Definitions

In this Chapter, the following definitions shall apply:

(1) "Commission" means the Feed, Fertilizer, and Agricultural Liming

Chemistry and Seed Commission.

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§1382. Commission; creation

A.(1) There is hereby created, within the Department of Agriculture and Forestry, the Louisiana Feed, Fertilizer, and Agricultural Liming Chemistry and Seed Commission. to be composed of the commissioner of agriculture and forestry, the director of the Louisiana Agricultural Experiment Station, the director of the Louisiana Cooperative Extension Service, the president of Louisiana Farm Bureau

1 Federation, Inc., the chairmen of the Livestock Advisory Committee and the Dairy 2 Advisory Committee of the Louisiana Farm Bureau Federation, Inc., the president 3 of the Louisiana Thoroughbred Breeder's Association, the president of the Louisiana Cattlemen's Association, the president of the Louisiana Ag Industries Association, 4 5 or their duly authorized representatives, a person who owns or operates a feed business which is not a member of the of the Louisiana Ag Industries Association, 6 7 and an independent feed manufacturer domiciled in Louisiana. The commission 8 shall consist of seven members as follows: 9 (1) The commissioner of agriculture and forestry or his designee. 10 (2) One member and an alternate, representing the Louisiana 11 Agricultural Experiment Station, appointed by the commissioner and who shall serve at the pleasure of the commissioner. 12 13 (3) One member and an alternate, representing the Louisiana Cooperative Extension Service, appointed by the commissioner and who shall 14 serve at the pleasure of the commissioner. 15 (4) The president of Louisiana Farm Bureau Federation, Inc. or his 16 17 designee, subject to the approval of the commissioner. (5) One member representing the seed industry appointed by the 18 19 commissioner from a list of three nominees submitted by the Louisiana Ag Industries Association who shall serve at the pleasure of the commissioner. 20 21 (6) One member representing the fertilizer industry appointed by the 22 commissioner from a list of three nominees submitted by the Louisiana Ag Industries Association who shall serve at the pleasure of the commissioner. 23 24 (7) One member representing the feed industry appointed by the commissioner from a list of three nominees submitted by the Louisiana Ag 25 26 Industries Association and a list of three nominees submitted by the Louisiana 27 Cattlemen's Association who shall serve at the pleasure of the commissioner. 28 (2) The prospective appointee who owns or operates a feed business which 29 is not a member of the Louisiana Ag Industries Association and the prospective

appointee who shall be an independent feed manufacturer domiciled in Louisiana shall be appointed by and shall serve at the pleasure of the governor. Each appointment by the governor shall be submitted to the Senate for confirmation.

B. The commissioner shall be ex officio chairman of the commission and shall be its chief executive officer responsible for enforcement of this Chapter. He is empowered to employ personnel, to purchase supplies, and to make such other expenditures as may be necessary for enforcing this Chapter. The commission may appoint a director and assistant director of the feed program, and a director and an assistant director of the fertilizer program, and a director and assistant director of the seed program who shall be appointed by the commission, subject to the approval of the commissioner. The directors and assistant directors shall be in the unclassified service. All employees of the commission shall be under the supervision and direction of the commissioner.

#### §1407. Disposition of funds; Feed and Fertilizer Fund

A.(1) All fees, assessments, penalties, and all other funds received by the commission under the provisions of Parts II and III of this Chapter, except for the deficiency assessments paid to the purchaser-user as provided for in R.S. 3:1415 and the consumer as provided for in R.S. 3:1430.13 and subject to the exceptions contained in Article VII, Section 9 of the Constitution of Louisiana, shall be deposited immediately upon receipt into the state treasury and shall be credited to the Bond Security and Redemption Fund.

(2) Out of the funds remaining in the Bond Security and Redemption Fund after a sufficient amount is allocated from that fund to pay all obligations secured by the full faith and credit of the state which become due and payable within any fiscal year, the treasurer, prior to placing the remaining funds in the state general fund, shall pay an amount equal to the total amount of funds paid into the state treasury by the commission under the provisions of Parts II and III of this Chapter into a special fund which is hereby created in the state treasury and designated as the "Feed

and Fertilizer Fund".

(3) All unexpended and unencumbered monies in the fund at the end of each fiscal year shall remain in the fund. The monies in the fund shall be invested by the treasurer in the same manner as monies in the state general fund. All interest earned on monies from the fund invested by the state treasurer shall be deposited in the fund.

B. Subject to appropriation, the monies in the Feed and Fertilizer Fund shall be used for the following purposes:

- (1) To provide for the expenses of the programs established by this <u>Parts II</u> and <u>III of this</u> Chapter and the expenses of the office of agricultural and environmental sciences, as determined by the commissioner.
- (2) To renovate, maintain, and equip a building on the Baton Rouge campus of the Louisiana State University and Agricultural and Mechanical College to provide administrative offices and analytical laboratories to be used in connection with the programs established by **Parts II and III of** this Chapter.
- (3) To build, equip, and maintain a building to house the offices of the Department of Agriculture and Forestry.
- (4) To fund any and all costs related to the fulfillment of the powers, responsibilities, and purposes of **Parts I, II and III of** this Chapter.

C. The Department of Agriculture and Forestry or the Louisiana Agricultural Finance Authority on behalf of the Department of Agriculture and Forestry may fund the anticipated funds appropriated from the Feed and Fertilizer Fund into revenue bonds for the purpose of renovating a building on the Baton Rouge campus of the Louisiana State University and Agricultural and Mechanical College to provide administrative offices and analytical laboratories to be used in connection with the programs established by **Parts II and III of** this Chapter and for the purpose of acquiring, constructing, renovating, and equipping buildings and related facilities for use by the Department of Agriculture and Forestry in connection with promoting and assisting agriculture and forestry in this state. The Department of Agriculture and

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1 Forestry may pledge those funds to secure the repayment of revenue bonds or to 2 secure a lease or purchase agreement entered into in connection with the issuance of 3 revenue bonds for those purposes. §1430.13. Disposition of fees and penalties 5 A. All fees and penalties provided for in this Chapter Part shall be paid to the 6 7 commission and disposed of as provided in this Section. 8 9 D. Out of the funds remaining in the Bond Security and Redemption Fund 10 after a sufficient amount is allocated from that fund to pay all obligations secured by 11 the full faith and credit of the state which become due and payable within any fiscal 12 year, the treasurer, prior to placing the remaining funds in the state general fund, 13 shall pay an amount equal to the total amount of the funds paid into the state treasury under the provisions of **Parts II and III of** this Chapter into the Feed and Fertilizer 14 Fund. The funds are to be used for the expenses of the programs established for the 15 purposes of Parts II and III of this Chapter and for the other purposes for which 16 funds in the Feed and Fertilizer Fund may be used as determined by the 17 commissioner. 18 19 §1431. Terms defined 20 As used in this Chapter Part, the following terms have the meanings given: 21 (1) "Advertisement" means all representations, other than those on the label, 22 disseminated in any manner or by any means, relating to seed within the scope of this Chapter Part. 23 24 (3) "Certified seeds", "registered seeds", and "foundation seeds" are seeds 25 which have been inspected and sampled during their period of growth and 26 27 preparation for market by the commissioner, or by the inspection official of the state in which the seeds were grown, and which have been found to conform to the 28

regulations issued by the commission under this Chapter Part.

1	(4) "Commission" means the <u>Agricultural Chemistry and</u> Seed
2	Commission.

4	(17) "Minor violation" means a violation of noncompliance that does not
5	create a competitive disadvantage for licensees in full compliance, is not a
6	violation that adversely affects human health, safety or the environment, is not
7	a violation performed with malicious, deliberate or fraudulent intent, and is not
8	a repetitive violation.
9	(18) "Mixed seeds" are seeds of more than one kind or variety when each
10	kind or variety is present in excess of five percent of the whole.
11	(18)(19) "Noxious weeds" are weeds which that are highly destructive and
12	difficult to control by good cultural practices and the use of herbicides.
13	(19)(20) "Origin" means place, state, or foreign country where grown.
14	(20)(21) "Other crop seeds" are the seeds of all kinds or varieties not of the
15	kind or variety declared on the label.
16	(21)(22) "Person" means any individual, firm, corporation, association, or
17	partnership.
18	(22)(23) "Prohibited noxious weed seeds" means any weed seeds which that
19	are prohibited from being present in agricultural, vegetable, flower, tree, or shrub
20	seed.
21	(23)(24) "Pure seeds" are all seeds of the kind and variety under
22	consideration, whether shriveled, cracked, or otherwise injured, and pieces of seeds
23	larger than one-half the original size.
24	(24)(25) "Retail seedsman" means any person who sells seed at retail directly
25	to the consumer either in quantities of not less than one pound or any quantity
26	including closed containers of less than one pound.
27	(25)(26) "Seed" is a propagative part of a plant capable of producing a new
28	plant, including but not limited to those parts commonly referred to as seeds, bulbs,
29	roots, tubers, and other propagating stock.

1	(26)(27) "Stop order" is any written or printed notice given by the
2	commissioner of the Department of Agriculture and Forestry or his authorized
3	agents, to the person with a lot of seed, directing the person not to sell or offer for
4	sale the seed until the requirements of this Chapter Part and regulations promulgated
5	hereunder have been complied with and a written release is issued. Such seeds may
6	be released for sale as feed.
7	(27)(28) "Treated" means that the seed has received an application of a
8	substance or that it has been subjected to a process for which a claim is made.
9	(28)(29) "Variety" is a subdivision of a kind characterized by growth, plant,
10	fruit, seed, or other characteristic by which it can be differentiated from other seeds
11	of the same kind.
12	(29)(30) "Vegetable seeds" are seeds of vegetable crops grown in gardens or
13	on truck farms.
14	(30)(31) "Weed seeds" are seeds of all plants that are considered to be
15	undesirable or troublesome in an area where the plant is not wanted.
16	* * *
17	§1433. Powers and duties of seed responsibilities of commission
18	A. The commission shall:
19	(1)(a) * * *
20	(b) Establish the standards and tolerances to be allowed in the administration
21	of this Chapter Part;

23	(f) Make all rules and regulations pertaining to the enforcement of this
24	Chapter Part.
25	* * *
26	(3) In making rules and regulations, give consideration to the following with
27	respect to each kind of seed or other propagating stock regulated by this Chapter
28	Part:

1	(4) Hold hearings on alleged violations of the provisions of this Chapter Part
2	or of the rules and regulations adopted pursuant to this Chapter Part.
3	(5) Advise the commissioner on the civil penalties to be imposed or the
4	injunctive or other civil relief to be sought to punish and restrain violations of the
5	provisions of this Chapter Part or of the rules and regulations adopted pursuant to
6	this Chapter Part.

8	(7) Declare plants to be weeds or noxious weeds in all or part of the state and
9	to prohibit, restrict, or regulate the sale, distribution, movement, and use of weed
10	seeds or noxious weed seeds by regulations adopted pursuant to this Chapter Part.

12	§1434. Powers and duties of the commissioner of agriculture
13	The commissioner shall:
14	(1) Enforce this Chapter Part and all rules and regulations made and adopted
15	by the commission.
16	(2) Sample, inspect, test, and make analyses of agricultural, vegetable, and
17	flower seeds transported, offered for sale, sold, or distributed in Louisiana for
18	planting purposes; determine whether the seeds are in compliance with this Chapter
19	Part and with rules and regulations made under this Chapter Part; and notify
20	promptly the person who transported, distributed, sold, or offered for sale the seeds
21	of any violation.
22	* * *
23	(4) Require reports necessary to administer this Chapter Part and rules and
24	regulations made under this Chapter Part.
25	(5) Collect, administer, and disburse the proceeds of the assessment, fees,
26	interest, penalties, and other monies collected pursuant to this Chapter Part.
27	§1435. Authority of the commissioner
28	The commissioner may:
29	(1) Employ agents necessary to enforce this Chapter Part and the rules and

1 regulations made under this Chapter Part. 2 (2) In order to have access to seeds subject to this Chapter Part, enter, during 3 regular business hours, any public or private premises where agricultural, vegetable, or flower seeds or other propagating stock is sold, offered for sale, or distributed. 4 (3) Issue and enforce a stop order to the person with a lot of seed or other 5 propagating stock which that the commissioner finds, or has good reason to believe, 6 7 is in violation of this Chapter Part or the rules and regulations made under this 8 Chapter Part. 9 (4) Establish and maintain a seed laboratory; employ a State seed analyst, 10 other analysts, and other personnel whose work he shall direct and supervise; and 11 incur such other expenses necessary to comply with this Chapter Part. 12 13 (6) Enter, either directly or through a duly authorized agent, the premises of any person producing, processing, distributing, or selling seeds and examine that 14 person's books, accounts, and records, and obtain any other information necessary, 15 for purposes of enforcing the provisions of this Chapter Part and the regulations 16 17 adopted pursuant to this Chapter Part. (7) Seek and obtain injunctive or other civil relief to restrain and prevent 18 19 violations of this Chapter Part, or rules and regulations adopted pursuant to this Chapter Part, or orders and rulings issued by the commissioner pursuant to this 20 21 Chapter Part. (8) Institute civil proceedings to enforce his orders or rulings, collect any 22 assessments, late fees, fines, penalties, or costs due under this Chapter Part or to 23 24 otherwise enforce the provisions of this Chapter Part or rules and regulations adopted pursuant to this Chapter Part. 25 §1436. Labeling of seeds 26 27 Each container of agricultural, vegetable, or flower seeds, or other propagating stock, which that is sold or offered for sale in Louisiana for planting 28

purposes shall bear thereon or have attached thereto in a conspicuous place a label

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1	plainly written or printed in the English language. The label shall give the following
2	information:
3	(1) For all agricultural, vegetable, and flower seeds treated as defined in this
4	Chapter Part for which a separate label may be used:
5	* * *
6	(2) On agricultural seeds:
7	(a) Except as otherwise provided herein, the commonly accepted name of the
8	kind and variety of each agricultural seed component in excess of five percent of the
9	whole, and the percentage of weight of each in the order of its predominance. The
10	provisions of this Subparagraph shall not prohibit the sale of wheat and oat seeds
11	which that are labeled "variety not stated" and which that meet the other
12	requirements of this Chapter Part. The commission may adopt rules and regulations
13	governing the sale and labeling of variety not stated wheat and oat seeds. Hybrids
14	shall be labeled as hybrids.

16	(5) On vegetable seeds in containers of one pound or less which that
17	germinate less than the standards established by the commission under the provisions
18	of R.S. 3:1433(3)(a):

20	(c) The word "Substandard Below Standard" in not less than eight-point
21	type.

23	§1437. Registration of seed dealers
24	A. Every person, except persons exempt by R.S. 3:1446 3:1445, who sells,
25	distributes, or offers or handles for sale agricultural, vegetable, or flower seeds or
26	other propagating stock of one pound or more in weight shall register with the
27	commissioner as a seed dealer. Every seed dealer shall register the number and
28	location of each place of business at which the seeds are sold, distributed, or offered
29	or handled for sale. The commissioner shall issue to the registered seed dealer a

1 license to engage in the business. 2 3 §1438. Suspension or revocation of seed dealer license Any licensee who violates any of the provisions of this Chapter Part or the 4 5 regulations adopted under the provisions of this Chapter Part shall be subject to having his license suspended, revoked, or placed on probation, in addition to any 6 7 other penalties authorized by this Chapter Part. 8 9 §1440. Stop order 10 A stop order shall prohibit further sale, exchange, movement, or distribution 11 of seeds included in the order until the commissioner is satisfied that this Chapter 12 **Part** and rules and regulations of the commission have been complied with and the 13 commissioner has issued a written release to the person with such seed. After a stop order is given, the person receiving the stop order shall have thirty days within which 14 to comply and to obtain a written release of the order. This Section shall not prevent 15 the commissioner from proceeding in accordance with other Sections in this Chapter 16 17 Part. §1441. Seizure 18 19 When the commissioner issues a stop order to a person with a lot of seed and such person fails to comply with this Chapter Part or the regulations of the 20 21 commission, the commissioner shall seize the lot of seed and shall destroy the lot 22 within thirty days, or shall dispose of it in the manner prescribed by the rules and regulations made by the commission. 23 24 §1443. Disclaimer or nonwarranty clause of no effect The use of a disclaimer or nonwarranty clause in any invoice, advertisement, 25 26 or label pertaining to seeds shall not exempt a person from the provisions of this 27 Chapter Part. §1444. Prohibitions 28 29 No person shall:

1	(1) Sell, offer for sale, transport, or distribute any agricultural, vegetable, or
2	flower seeds unless the seeds have been tested in accordance with the rules and
3	regulations adopted by the Agricultural Chemistry and Seed Commission. The
4	commission by rule may require information relative to the test to be affixed to the
5	packaging of the seeds.
6	(2) Sell, offer for sale, transport, or distribute any agricultural, vegetable or
7	flower seeds which that are not labeled in accordance with this Chapter Part or
8	which that have false or misleading labeling.

10	(4) Sell, offer for sale, transport, or distribute any agricultural seeds
11	containing noxious weed seeds, subject to tolerances and methods of determinations,
12	in excess of those prescribed under this Chapter Part.
13	(5) Detach, deface, destroy, or use a second time any label provided for in
14	this Chapter Part or the rules and regulations made by the commission.

16	(8) Obstruct in any way any authorized person in the performance of his
17	duties under this Chapter Part.

19	§1445. Exemptions
20	A. The provisions of R.S. 3:1436 shall not apply:
21	(1) To common carriers with respect to seeds transported in the ordinary
22	course of business as a carrier. R.S. 3:1436 shall apply to carriers engaged in
23	processing or merchandising seeds subject to the provisions of this Chapter Part.
24	* * *
25	(3) To agricultural seeds when grown, sold, and delivered by the producer
26	on his own premises when the growing of crops for reproductive purposes is not the
27	primary farming occupation of the producer. If the seeds are advertised for sale
28	through any medium or if the seeds are delivered by a common carrier, except for the
29	purpose of recleaning, they shall be labeled in accordance with this Chapter Part.

1	B. The provisions of R.S. 3:1444 shall not apply:

7	(3) To agricultural seeds when grown, sold, and delivered by the producer
8	on his own premises when the growing of crops for reproductive purposes is not the
9	primary farming occupation of the producer. If the seeds are advertised for sale
10	through any medium or if the seeds are delivered by a common carrier, except for the
11	purpose of recleaning, they shall be labeled in accordance with this Chapter Part.

13	§1446. Penalty for violation; procedures for imposition of penalties
14	A. Whoever violates this Chapter Part or the rules and regulations made
15	under this Chapter Part shall may be subject to a civil penalty of not more than five
16	hundred dollars for each act of violation and for each day of violation. Each day on
17	which a violation occurs shall be a separate offense.
18	B. Penalties may be assessed only by a ruling of the commission based upon
19	an adjudicatory hearing held in accordance with the provisions of the Administrative
20	Procedure Act and this Chapter Part as follows:
21	(1) The commission shall be convened by the commissioner for the purpose
22	of hearing any alleged violation of this Chapter Part or any rule and regulation
23	adopted pursuant to this Chapter Part.

25	(5) Nothing in this Section shall be construed as requiring the
26	commission to institute adjudicatory proceedings for minor violations of this
27	Part when the department believes that the public interest will best be served

§1449. Disposition of funds; Seed Commission Fund

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A. All assessments, fees, penalties, and other funds received under the 2 3 provisions of this Chapter Part shall be disposed of in accordance with the following provisions: 4 (1) All assessments, fees, penalties, and all other funds received under the 5 provisions of this Chapter Part, subject to the exceptions contained in Article VII, 6 7 Section 9 of the Constitution of Louisiana, shall be deposited immediately upon 8 receipt into the state treasury and shall be credited to the Bond Security and 9 Redemption Fund. 10 (2) Out of the funds remaining in the Bond Security and Redemption Fund 11 after a sufficient amount is allocated from that fund to pay all obligations secured by 12 the full faith and credit of the state which that become due and payable within any 13 fiscal year, the treasurer, prior to placing the remaining funds in the state general fund, shall pay an amount equal to the total amount of funds paid into the state 14 treasury under the provisions of this Chapter Part into a special fund which is hereby 15 created in the state treasury and designated as the Seed Commission Fund. 16 17 B. Subject to appropriation, the monies in the fund shall be used for the 18 19 following purposes: (1) To provide for the expenses of the program established by this Chapter 20 21 **Part**, as determined by the commission commissioner. 22 (2) To fund any and all costs related to the carrying out of the powers and duties granted to the commission and the commissioner of agriculture and forestry 23 24 under this Chapter Part. Section 2. R.S. 36:629(H) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows: 25 §629. Present law (R.S. 3:1382) provides for the Louisiana Feed, Fertilizer, and Agricultural Liming Commission, within the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and Forestry (LDAF), composed of the following members:

<u>Proposed law</u> changes <u>present law</u> to create the Louisiana Agricultural Chemistry and Seed Commission, within the LDAF, composed of the following seven members:

- (1) The commissioner of agriculture and forestry or his designee.
- (2) One member and an alternate, representing the Louisiana Agricultural Experiment Station, appointed by the commissioner who serves at the pleasure of the commissioner.
- (3) One member and an alternate, representing the Louisiana Cooperative Extension Service, appointed by the commissioner who serves at the pleasure of the commissioner.
- (4) The president of Louisiana Farm Bureau Federation, Inc. or his designee as approved by the commissioner.
- (5) One member representing the seed industry appointed by the commissioner from a list of three nominees submitted by the Louisiana Ag Industries Association who shall serve at the pleasure of the commissioner.
- (6) One member representing the fertilizer industry appointed by the commissioner from a list of three nominees submitted by the Louisiana Ag Industries Association who shall serve at the pleasure of the commissioner.
- (7) One member representing the feed industry appointed by the commissioner from a list of three nominees submitted by the Louisiana Ag Industries Association and a list of three nominees submitted by the Louisiana Cattlemen's Association who shall serve at the pleasure of the commissioner.

<u>Proposed law</u> authorizes the commission to appoint a director and assistant director of the seed program.

<u>Proposed law</u> defines "minor violation" as a violation of noncompliance which does not create a competitive disadvantage for licensees in full compliance; is not a violation which adversely affects human health, safety or the environment; is not a violation performed with malicious, deliberate or fraudulent intent; and is not a repetitive violation.

Present law provides for the disposition of funds related to fertilizer and creates the "Feed

and Fertilizer Fund".

<u>Proposed law</u> repeals <u>present law</u> because the "Feed and Fertilizer Fund" was already created in R.S. 3:1407.

<u>Present law</u> (R.S. 3:1432) provides for the Seed Commission composed of the following five members: commissioner of agriculture and forestry, director of Louisiana Cooperative Extension Service, director of Louisiana Agricultural Experiment Station, president of Louisiana Ag Industries Association, and president of Louisiana Farm Bureau Federation, Inc., or their designees. <u>Present law</u> authorizes the commission to employ a director and assistant director in the unclassified service and further authorizes the commissioner to employ all other necessary personnel.

<u>Proposed law</u> repeals <u>present law</u> and transfers the powers, duties, and functions of the Seed Commission to the Agricultural Chemistry and Seed Commission.

<u>Present law</u> (R.S. 3:1444(11)) prohibits a person from relabeling seeds more than one time.

Proposed law repeals present law.

<u>Present law</u> provides that violators shall be subject to a civil penalty of not more than \$500 for each act of violation and for each day of violation.

Proposed law changes "shall" to "may" on civil penalties for violations.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the commission is not required to institute adjudicatory proceedings for minor violations when the department believes that the public interest will best be served by a suitable notice of noncompliance in writing.

<u>Present law</u> (R.S. 3:1449) provides for the Seed Commission Fund and authorizes the Seed Commission to determine the expenses of the program.

<u>Proposed law</u> changes the name of the fund <u>from</u> "Seed Commission Fund" <u>to</u> "Seed Fund" and authorizes the commissioner to determine the expenses of the program.

Proposed law repeals bond requirements for agents of nurserymen.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides for technical corrections and corrects internal references.

Effective upon signature of the governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
