Limits the solar energy systems tax credit to one for each residence or for each dwelling unit in a residential rental apartment project. (gov sig)

<u>Current law</u> provides a refundable income tax credit of 50% of the purchase and installation of a residential wind or solar system up to \$25,000 (\$12,500 in credits). The credit is allowed for single family and multi-family residence installations and is issued to the homeowner, installer, or a third party system lessor. The program cost is not capped and does not sunset. The credit is limited to one system per residence.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains current law and specifically states that only one system will be allowed for each dwelling unit in a residential apartment project.
