# DIGEST

### Peacock (SB 81)

<u>Present law</u> provides no person shall undertake, offer to undertake, or agree to perform home improvement contracting services unless registered with and approved by the Residential Building Contractors Subcommittee (subcommittee) of the State Licensing Board for Contractors (board) as a home improvement contractor. <u>Present law</u> provides for a list of exceptions to the registration requirement, one of which is an exception for a homeowner who physically performs home improvement work on his personal residence.

<u>Proposed law</u> adds an exception to the <u>present law</u> home improvement contracting registration requirement for a person who physically performs home improvement work on other property owned by him when the work has a value of less than \$7,500.

Effective August 1, 2013.

# <u>Committee Amendments Proposed by Senate Committee on Commerce, Consumer</u> <u>Protection, and International Affairs to the original bill</u>

1. Revises language to provide that no individual shall undertake on his own property self-performed home improvement contracting services having a value in excess of \$7,500 unless registered and approved as a home improvement contractor.

1. Adds an exception to the requirement of home improvement contracting registration for a person who physically performs home improvement work on property owned by him when the work has a value of less than \$7,500.
