SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 98

COMMENDATIONS. Commends the Adai Caddo Indian tribe for their cultural contributions to the state of Louisiana.

2	To commend the Adai Caddo Indian tribe for their cultural contributions to the state of
3	Louisiana.
4	WHEREAS, the Adai Caddo Indian nation is an independent tribe, one of
5	approximately twenty-five different tribes with separate Caddeon names, who occupied a
6	territory of four hundred miles and covered portions of present day states of western
7	Louisiana, eastern Texas, western Arkansas, and north through Oklahoma up to the Canadian
8	border; and
9	WHEREAS, the Adai Indian nation was first part of the nomadic territory of the
10	Pawnee and Wichita territory, and considered one of the largest North American Indian
11	tribes with first European contact; and
12	WHEREAS, as traders and situated in an ideal geographical area, the Adai became
13	a resourceful and productive conduit of trade between the Plains Indians west of the Sabine
14	River, and the tribes of the southeast; and
15	WHEREAS, when horses and cattle were introduced by the Spanish, the Adai
16	became excellent horsemen and some of the region's first cowboys, rounding up Mustangs
17	and wild cattle for trade and enhancing their commerce; and
18	WHEREAS, the Adai resided near a principal village, now known as Robeline,

1 Louisiana in the western part of Natchitoches Parish, formerly part of the Texas territory in 2 1818, and through Indian trades with the American and Spanish governments, their boundary 3 lines were extended west to the Sabine River, formerly called Rio de Los Adais by the 4 Spaniards and then became part of Louisiana; and WHEREAS, the Adai tribe reservation, a land grant community and on the National 5 Registry of Historic Places, has become a favored and ever-popular tourist spot of visitors 6 7 from around the world, and a travel attraction by elementary school children, high school 8 and college students, while generating several million dollars in development for the Adai, 9 neighboring parishes, and the entire state of Louisiana; and 10 WHEREAS, founded respectively in 1717 and 1721, the Adai has two national 11 landmarks bearing their tribal name, Presidio de Los Adais, and the Catholic Indian Mission 12 Church St. Michael of the Adais. THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Senate of the Legislature of Louisiana 13 14 does hereby commend the Adai Caddo Indian tribe for their rich cultural contributions to 15 Louisiana. 16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be transmitted to Chief 17 Rufus Davis, Jr.
