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HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 109

WATERWAYS/NAVIGATION: Requests that the United States Army Corps of Engineers maintain a minimum of 9 foot deep by 200 foot wide channel to allow safe and reliable barge transportation on the J. Bennett Johnston Waterway

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

2	To urge and request that the United States Army Corps of Engineers maintain, through its
3	dredging process, a minimum of a nine foot deep by two hundred foot wide channel
4	to allow safe and reliable barge transportation on the J. Bennett Johnston Waterway
5	on the Red River and to maintain such navigability on the Red River twenty-four
6	hours per day, seven days per week, three hundred sixty-five days per year, as
7	required by Section 101 of the River and Harbor Act of 1968, P.L. 90-483 and to
8	urge and request that the United States Army Corps of Engineers operate all local
9	and dam facilities on the Red River twenty-four hours per day, seven days per week,
10	three hundred sixty-five days per year.
11	WHEREAS, in 1968 the United States Congress authorized the Red River Waterway
12	Project; and
13	WHEREAS, the purpose of the project was to enable year-round navigation on the
14	Red River by straightening the river, stabilizing its banks and constructing five locks and
15	dams; and
16	WHEREAS, the Port of Caddo-Bossier and others were constructed to grow
17	commerce on the Red River, one of the region's top assets; and
18	WHEREAS, in 2007 an economic impact study concluded that the economic benefit
19	of the project to the seven-parish region included attracting four billion six hundred million

1	dollars in new monies, increasing household earnings by two billion eight hundred million
2	dollars, and creating an average of two thousand one hundred seven new jobs per year; and
3	WHEREAS, the United States Army Corps of Engineers has issued a Congressional
4	mandate to assure such navigability for commercial and recreational development; and
5	WHEREAS, a minimum nine foot deep by two hundred foot wide channel provides
6	reliable usage of the Red River, not only for current industries, but for others considering
7	locating to the Red River; and
8	WHEREAS, in addition, the Red River is utilized for recreation and tourism,
9	including hosting the 2009 and 2012 Bassmaster Classic, which is another import economic
10	development engine.
11	THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby
12	urge and request that the United States Army Corps of Engineers maintain, through its
13	dredging process, a minimum of a nine foot deep by two hundred foot wide channel to allow
14	safe and reliable barge transportation on the J. Bennett Johnston Waterway on the Red River
15	and to maintain such navigability on the Red River twenty-four hours per day, seven days
16	per week, three hundred sixty-five days per year, as required by Section 101 of the River and
17	Harbor Act of 1968, P.L. 90-483.
18	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby urge,
19	request, and recommend that the United States Army Corps of Engineers operate all lock and
20	dam facilities on the Red River twenty-four hours per day, seven days per week, three
21	hundred sixty-five days per year.
22	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be transmitted to each
23	member of the Louisiana congressional delegation.
24	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be transmitted to
25	Colonel Jeffrey R. Eckstein, district commander of the Vicksburg District, United States
26	Army Corps of Engineers.

Burford HCR No. 109

Urges and requests that the United States Army Corps of Engineers maintain, through its dredging process, a minimum of a 9' deep by 200' wide channel to allow safe and reliable barge transportation on the J. Bennett Johnston Waterway on the Red River and to maintain such navigability on the Red River 24 hours per day, 7 days per week, 365 days per year, as required by the River and Harbor Act of 1968.

Urges and requests that the United States Army Corps of Engineers operate all lock and dam facilities on the Red River twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week, three hundred and sixty-five days a year.

Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

Committee Amendments Proposed by <u>House Committee on Transportation, Highways</u> and <u>Public Works</u> to the <u>original</u> bill.

- 1. Added a provision urging and requesting that the United States Army Corps of Engineers operate all lock and dam facilities on the Red River twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week, three hundred and sixty-five days a year.
- 2. Made technical changes.
