WILDLIFE & FISHERIES CMN: Adds new members to the Wildlife and Fisheries Commission

1 AN ACT

2 To amend and reenact R.S. 36:601(A) and R.S. 56:1(C) and (D), relative to the Wildlife and
3 Fisheries Commission; to provide relative to the membership of the commission; to
4 provide for appointment and terms of office; to provide an effective date; and to
5 provide for related matters.

6 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

7 Section 1. R.S. 36:601(A) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

8 §601. Wildlife and Fisheries Commission

9 A. The control and supervision of the wildlife of the state, including all
10 aquatic life, is vested in the Louisiana Wildlife and Fisheries Commission. The
11 commission shall be in the executive branch and shall consist of seven members
12 appointed by the governor, subject to confirmation by the Senate. Six of the
13 members shall serve for overlapping terms of six years, and one shall serve for a
14 term concurrent with that of the governor. Three members shall be electors of the
15 coastal parishes and representatives of the commercial fishing and fur industries, two
16 members shall be electors appointed at large from the parishes located north of a line
17 created by the northern boundary of the parishes of Beauregard, Allen, Evangeline,
18 Avoyelles, and Pointe Coupee, and ~~four~~ two shall be electors from the state at large
19 other than representatives of the commercial fishing and fur industries, ~~as provided~~

Abstract: Requires two of the at-large members of the Wildlife and Fisheries Commission be appointed from the northern parishes of the state.

Present law provides that the Wildlife and Fisheries Commission consist of seven members to be appointed by the governor to represent certain industries and at large from the state.

Proposed law retains present law and specifies that two of the at-large members must each be electors from north of a line created by the northern boundary of the parishes of Beauregard, Allen, Evangeline, Avoyelles, and Pointe Coupee.

Proposed law becomes effective if, as, and when the amendment to the constitution proposed by HB No. 426 of the 2013 R.S. is adopted at a statewide election and becomes effective.

Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

Committee Amendments Proposed by House Committee on Natural Resources and Environment to the original bill.

1. Remove the additional commission members.
2. Provide that the terms of office remain the same as present law.
3. Require that two of the commissioners appointed at-large from the state be electors of parishes located north of a line created by the northern boundaries of the parishes of Beauregard, Allen, Evangeline, Avoyelles, and Pointe Coupee.
4. Remove the transition provisions for the additional members.
