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BUDGETARY PROCEDURES (Constitutional Amendment) Limits the power of an appropriation bill to effect change in other laws

Proposed constitutional amendment provides that neither the general appropriation bill nor any ancillary appropriation bill that shall contain any nonmonetary provision the effect of which is to alter a law except for the specific and limited purpose of imposing gualifications, conditions, limitations or restrictions that have a direct connexity to the expenditure of the funds being appropriated. To be submitted to the statewide elections on November 4, 2014.

EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION

There is no anticipated direct material effect on governmental expenditures as a result of this measure. The proposed constitutional amendment seeks to prevent specific statutory changes from being included within the General Appropriation Bill (HB 1) and the Ancillary Appropriation Bill.

The proposed bill provides that the constitutional amendment be submitted to voters at the November 4, 2014 election. The November 4, 2014 election is a statewide election, when all precincts in the state are scheduled to be opened. As a regular practice, the Secretary of State budgets for up to 10 constitutional amendments for the fall statewide elections.

REVENUE EXPLANATION

There is no anticipated direct material effect on governmental revenues as a result of this measure.
