HOUSE SUMMARY OF SENATE AMENDMENTS

House Bill No. 218 by Representative Norton

MOTOR VEHICLES: Exempts operators of certain autocycles from requirements to obtain an "M" endorsement or wear a safety helmet

Synopsis of Senate Amendments

1. Made technical changes.

Digest of Bill as Finally Passed by Senate

<u>Present law</u> defines "autocycle" to mean an enclosed motorcycle that is equipped with safety belts, rollbar, windshield wipers, steering wheel, and equipment otherwise required on a motorcycle and which has no more than three wheels in contact with the roadway at any one time.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and adds that an "autocycle" shall also include enclosed motorcycles with a roll cage.

Proposed law defines "roll cage" as used in the definition of "autocycle".

<u>Present law</u> exempts persons operating or riding in an autocycle with a roof that meets or exceeds standards from having to wear a safety helmet.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and exempts persons operating or riding in an autocycle with a roll cage from having to wear a safety helmet. Also, defines "roll cage" in the context of autocycles for which the exemption applies.

<u>Present law</u> requires operators of motorcycles to obtain a special endorsement on their driver's license.

<u>Proposed law</u> exempts operators of autocycles with certain features from requirement to obtain a special endorsement on their driver's license.

Effective Jan. 1, 2014.
