2	To commend Randy K. Haynie for his generous loan to the state of Louisiana for public
3	display of a rare Eighteen-Star American National Flag Commemorating Louisiana
4	Statehood.
5	WHEREAS, Randy K. Haynie has been closely involved with Louisiana politics for
6	many years, but he is also vitally interested in the colorful history of the Bayou State, as well
7	as the preservation of the numerous historical artifacts that have survived war, sickness and
8	societal upheaval; and
9	WHEREAS, Mr. Haynie has collected a number of these artifacts and saved them
10	from certain destruction and loss and shared them with the people of Louisiana in order to
11	help the people understand and stay in touch with the rich culture that shaped and formed
12	their society; and
13	WHEREAS, Mr. Haynie was fortunate to have come across a significant piece of
14	Louisiana's history during his participation in and organizing of the state's Bicentennial
15	Celebration; and
16	WHEREAS, Mr. Haynie was able to acquire a rare piece of americana when he
17	purchased the Eighteen-Star American National Flag Commemorating Louisiana Statehood
18	and entry into the Union; and

1	WHEREAS, Mr. Haynie has offered to loan Louisiana officials the flag to be
2	displayed inside the State Capitol Building where all visiting members of the public could
3	see one of only three such flags in existence today; and
4	WHEREAS, the rare flag was hand-sewn by the seamen of the U.S.S. Constitution
5	sometime during the period between 1812 and 1816, after Louisiana was admitted as the
6	eighteenth state on April 30, 1812, with William C.C. Claiborne as the first governor of the
7	state; and
8	WHEREAS, the ownership of the flag had come down to Mrs. Jennie L. Wood, on
9	her mother's side of the family from her uncle Joseph L. Galloway, a direct descendent of
10	Thomas Galloway, a sergeant in General Gabriel Slaughter's Regiment of the Fifteenth
11	Kentucky Militia at the Battle of New Orleans on January 8, 1815; and
12	WHEREAS, the flag has thirteen alternating stripes and thirteen cotton-muslin stars
13	on a blue canton, but this would soon change as more states joined the union and a new star
14	would be added for each new state; and
15	WHEREAS, Randy Haynie should be hailed by all of Louisiana for the countless
16	hours he has given to making the state's citizens more aware of their heritage, culture and
17	history and for his generous philanthropic contributions to that end.
18	THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Senate of the Legislature of Louisiana
19	does hereby extend its highest and most sincere commendations to Randy K. Haynie for his
20	generous loan of the famous flag in order to display it in the Louisiana State Capitol
21	Building for the state's bicentennial celebration.
22	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be transmitted to Mr.
23	Randy K. Haynie.
