AN ACT

2	To amend and reenact Subpart C of Part II of Chapter 3 of Title 46 of the Louisiana Revised
3	Statutes of 1950, comprised of R.S. 46:261, relative to the Fatherhood First
4	Initiative; to establish the Fatherhood First Initiative; to establish a Fatherhood First
5	Council; to provide for membership and duties of the council; to provide for a
6	research and demonstration program; to require reporting; and to provide for related
7	matters.
8	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
9	Section 1. Subpart C of Part II of Chapter 3 of Title 46 of the Louisiana Revised
10	Statutes of 1950, comprised of R.S. 46:261, is hereby amended and reenacted to read as
11	follows:
12	SUBPART C. FATHERHOOD <u>FIRST</u> INITIATIVE
13	§261. Fatherhood <u>first</u> initiative; establishment
14	A. The secretary of the Department of Children and Family Services, within
15	available appropriations to the extent that funds are available and appropriated by the
16	legislature, shall establish a program to be known as the "Fatherhood First Initiative".
17	This program shall promote the positive involvement and interaction of fathers with
18	their children with an emphasis on children eligible or formerly eligible for services
19	funded by the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) block grant. This
20	program shall identify those services that effectively encourage and enhance
21	responsible and skillful parenting and those services that increase the ability of
22	fathers to meet the financial and medical needs of their children through employment

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1	services and chind support emorcement measures. The objectives of the program
2	shall be to:
3	(1) Promote public education concerning the financial and emotional
4	responsibilities of fatherhood.
5	(2) Assist men in preparation for the legal, financial, and emotional
6	responsibilities of fatherhood.
7	(3) Promote the establishment of paternity at childbirth.
8	(4) Encourage fathers, regardless of marital status, to foster their emotional
9	connections to and financial support of their children.
10	(5) Establish support mechanisms for fathers in their relationships with their
11	children, regardless of their marital and financial status.
12	(6) Integrate state and local services available for families.
13	(7) Promote public education and increase public awareness of resources for
14	the following areas:
15	(a) Substance abuse and addiction.
16	(b) Anger management and conflict resolution.
17	(c) Fiscal awareness and financial literacy.
18	(d) Parenting skills, child development, and family studies.
19	B. The secretary of the Department of Children and Family Services shall
20	convene and chair a Fatherhood First Council. The secretary shall convene the
21	council no later than October 1, 2013. The secretary shall seek the advice and
22	participation of any person, organization, or state or federal agency deemed
23	necessary to carry out the provisions of this Section. The secretary may designate
24	a working group from among the members of the council to carry out specific duties
25	required pursuant to this Section.
26	C. The Fatherhood First Council shall perform the following functions:
27	(1) Develop a comprehensive plan to promote the positive involvement and
28	interaction of fathers with their children.
29	(2) Conduct an evaluation of state programs, government policies, and
30	community initiatives relative to fatherhood.

1	(5) Advise the secretary of the Department of Children and Family Services
2	on the development of a fatherhood research and demonstration program relative to
3	design, implementation, and evaluation pursuant to this Section.
4	D. The membership of the council shall be appointed by the secretary and
5	shall include but not be limited to:
6	(1) The secretary of the Department of Children and Family Services or his
7	designee.
8	(2) The secretary of the Louisiana Workforce Commission or his designee.
9	(3) The superintendent of the Department of Education or his designee.
10	(4) The secretary of the Department of Public Safety and Corrections or his
11	designee.
12	(5) Two representatives of the Children's Cabinet Advisory Board.
13	(6) One representative of the Louisiana District Attorneys Association.
14	(7) One representative of a regional workforce investment board.
15	(8) One representative of the clergy.
16	(9) One representative of the New Orleans Fatherhood Consortium of Loyola
17	University of New Orleans.
18	(10) One member with expertise in male psychology and health.
19	(11) One representative of the Second Time Around Grandparents Support
20	Group.
21	(12) The member of the Louisiana House of Representatives representing
22	House District Number 99 or his designee.
23	(13) One member of the Louisiana Senate appointed by the president.
24	E. The Fatherhood First Council shall establish a comprehensive plan for the
25	implementation of the Fatherhood First Initiative and the research and demonstration
26	program. The plan may include but shall not be limited to the following:
27	(1) A planning process that gathers input from the public through public
28	hearings or other means.
29	(2) The establishment of an inventory and evaluation of state and federal
30	programs, community initiatives, government policies, and any other services

identified that encourage and enhance responsible and skillful parenting through positive involvement and interaction with fathers and those services that increase the ability of fathers to meet the financial and medical needs of their children. In establishing the inventory and evaluation, the council may collect and assess data to determine the scope of concerns, review fatherhood programs in other jurisdictions, identify private, state, and federal funding opportunities, or collect any other information the council deems necessary.

- (3) The identification of the services that can be provided to fathers including but not limited to employment services, parenting skills, teen pregnancy prevention services, educational services, child support enforcement services, paternity establishment services, custody and visitation services, conflict management services, family mediation, and any other community-based support programs providing assistance to fathers.
- (4) The identification of the characteristics that will be used to target the population to be served in each demonstration program.
- (5) A system that establishes mechanisms for voluntary and mandatory access to the services provided in the program for those individuals identified for participation including procedures for establishing and assessing the eligibility of an individual for the services provided in the program and procedures for providing guidance to courts ordering a noncustodial parent's participation in the program in addition to a child support or medical support obligation.
- (6) The identification of a case management system for the full range of services offered in the program including mechanisms for referring program participants to community-based support programs.
- F. The secretary of the Department of Children and Family Services, in consultation with the executive director of the Louisiana Workforce Commission, shall establish a research and demonstration program that specifically evaluates the effectiveness and outcomes of services provided to fathers. The research and demonstration program shall be administered in not more than three research and demonstration sites from specific geographic regions or judicial districts and no more

than one hundred fathers may participate in each site.

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2 demonstration sites shall have an ability to: 3 (1) Utilize existing local, state, and federal resources. 4 (2) Collaborate with broad-based constituencies representing schools, 5 municipal entities, nonprofit organizations, and other neighborhood, religious, 6 health, and community organizations. 7 (3) Provide a safe, caring environment for participants. The sites shall have 8 experience serving the targeted population. Each site shall provide services that 9 recognize the cultural diversity of the population served. The secretary of the 10 Department of Children and Family Services shall seek assistance in evaluating the 11 effectiveness and outcomes from an institution of higher education, a consortium of 12 institutes of higher education, or another qualified entity. The evaluation shall 13 measure the effectiveness and outcomes of services in the following areas: 14 (a) Child support and medical support. 15 (b) Job placement and retention. 16 (c) Increased earnings. 17 (d) Increased visitation. 18 (e) Family reunification. 19 (f) Paternity establishment or adjudication. 20 (g) The need of a custodial parent for public and medical assistance. 21 (h) Teen pregnancy prevention. 22 (i) Effect on fathers under the age of twenty-three years. 23 (j) Low-income or unemployed fathers. 24 (k) Educational levels. 25 (1) Measures of emotional involvement of fathers. 26 (m) The overall cost effectiveness, including a cost-benefit analysis of the 27 services provided on an aggregate and case-by-case basis. 28 (n) Substance abuse and addiction treatment. 29 (o) Anger management and conflict resolution. 30 (p) Fiscal awareness and financial literacy.

1	(q) Parenting skins, child development, and family studies.
2	G.(1) No later than March 1, 2014, the Fatherhood First Council shall submit
3	an interim report relative to the status of the comprehensive plan established
4	pursuant to this Section to the secretary of the Department of Children and Family
5	Services. The secretary shall add his assessments thereto and present the findings
6	to the House and Senate committees on health and welfare, the House Committee on
7	Appropriations, and the Senate Committee on Finance prior to the start of the 2014
8	Regular Session of the Legislature.
9	(2) No later than March 1, 2015, the council shall submit a final report to the
10	secretary on the comprehensive plan which may include:
11	(a) Recommendations for the continued implementation of the Fatherhood
12	First Initiative.
13	(b) Recommendations for the expansion or statewide implementation of
14	fatherhood programs.
15	(3) The secretary shall add his assessments thereto and present the findings
16	to the House and Senate committees on health and welfare, the House Committee on
17	Appropriations, and the Senate Committee on Finance prior to the start of the 2015
18	Regular Session of the Legislature.
19	(4) After the presentation by the secretary to the legislative committees as
20	provided in Paragraph (3) of this Subsection, the department may, to the extent that
21	funds are available and appropriated by the legislature, continue to implement the
22	Fatherhood First Initiative.
