**Abstract:** Allows the driver of a trailer to show only a valid inspection sticker when stopped by a police officer or other officer authorized to inspect the trailer rather than having to be in immediate possession of the title and registration.

<u>Present law</u> allows police officers to issue traffic citations for failing to comply with the inspection requirements to drivers of trailers who do not have the title and registration on their person.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that in order to be in compliance with the inspection laws, an owner or operator of a light trailer, utility trailer, boat trailer, or farm trailer need only provide the inspecting officer with a valid inspection sticker, as opposed to the title and registration of the trailer.
