PORTS/HARBORS/TERMINALS. Removes Ascension Parish from the Greater Baton Rouge Port Commission and places it in the Port of South Louisiana. (8/1/14)(2/3-CA6s43)

1	AN ACT
2	To amend and reenact R.S. 34:1221(A), 1223(A), 1224(A), 2471(A), 2473(A), and
3	2473.1(B), relative to ports; to change the jurisdictional boundaries of the port areas
4	of the Greater Baton Rouge Port Commission and the Port of South Louisiana; to
5	remove Ascension Parish from the Greater Baton Rouge Port Commission; to add
6	Ascension Parish to the Port of South Louisiana; to revise membership of the Greater
7	Baton Rouge Port Commission; to revise membership of the Port of South Louisiana
8	Commission; and to provide for related matters.
9	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
10	Section 1. R.S. 34:1221(A), 1223(A), 1224(A), 2471(A), 2473(A), and 2473.1(B)
11	are hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:
12	CHAPTER 7. GREATER BATON ROUGE PORT COMMISSION
13	§1221. Creation of Greater Baton Rouge Port Commission; per diem; number of
14	days per diem allowed
15	A. There is hereby created a commission to be known as the Greater Baton
16	Rouge Port Commission which shall be composed of fifteen thirteen members
17	appointed by the governor who shall serve at the pleasure of the governor. The

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1	members shall receive per diem; provided, however, that the per diem of each
2	member shall not exceed seventy-five dollars per day during the time the member
3	is in actual attendance upon the board, or performing duties authorized by the board.
4	The per diem shall be payable for a maximum of twenty-four days per year, except
5	if an emergency is declared by the governor. During the period of an emergency as
6	determined by the governor, the commission shall be authorized to hold as many
7	meetings or emergency activities as the commission deems necessary and the
8	members shall be paid per diem for such meetings or activities. Members shall be
9	appointed as follows:
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(1) Three commissioners shall be appointed by the governor from a panel of
six names submitted by the legislative delegation of the parish of West Baton Rouge;
(2) Six commissioners shall be appointed by the governor from a panel of

eighteen names submitted by the East Baton Rouge Parish legislative delegation;

14 (3) Two commissioners shall be appointed by the governor from a panel of
15 six names submitted by the legislative delegation of the parish of Iberville;

16 (4) Two commissioners shall be appointed by the governor from a panel of
 17 six names submitted by the legislative delegation of the parish of Ascension;

- 18 (5) Two commissioners shall be appointed by the governor from a panel of
 19 six four names submitted by Louisiana Farm Bureau Federation, Inc. Of the six four
 20 names submitted, three two shall reside on the east side of the Mississippi River in
 21 Ascension, East Baton Rouge; or Iberville Parishes and three two shall reside on the
 22 west side of the Mississippi River in Ascension, Iberville; or West Baton Rouge
 23 Parishes and the governor shall appoint one of the nominees from the east side and
 24 one from the west side of the Mississippi River.

 §1223. Rights and powers of the board

A. The commission shall exercise the powers herein conferred upon it within
the port area consisting of the parishes of East Baton Rouge, West Baton Rouge, <u>and</u>
Iberville, and Ascension as the boundaries and limits are presently fixed by law,

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1 2 except the industrial areas created in the parish of East Baton Rouge by the provisions of Section 1.08(b) of the Plan of Government for the parish of East Baton Rouge and the city of Baton Rouge.

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§1224. Authority for issuance of bonds; ad valorem tax

A. The commission, with the approval of the State Bond Commission, is 6 7 authorized to incur debt for its lawful purposes and to issue in its name, negotiable 8 bonds or notes therefor, and to pledge, for the payment of the principal and interest 9 of such negotiable bonds or notes, the revenues derived from the operation of 10 properties and facilities maintained and operated by it, or received by the commission from other sources; however, the amount of such bonds and notes 11 outstanding at any one time shall not exceed one hundred million dollars. Such 12 13 bonds, when authorized to be issued, shall constitute, first, a general obligation of the commission, and secondly, the full faith and credit of the parish of East Baton 14 Rouge, the parish of West Baton Rouge, the parish of Iberville, and thirdly, the state 15 of Louisiana, and shall be and are hereby pledged. The full faith and credit of the 16 parish of Ascension is hereby irrevocably pledged on a parity with that of the 17 parishes of East Baton Rouge, West Baton Rouge, and Iberville in respect to the 18 19 Commission's bonds, notes, and obligations presently outstanding, as well as to all 20 bonds, notes, and obligations hereafter authorized, sold, and incurred by the 21 Commission on August 1, 2014. In addition to the pledge of revenues to secure said 22 bonds and notes, the commission may further secure their payment by a conventional mortgage upon any or all of the properties constructed or acquired, or to be 23 constructed and acquired by it. The commission is further authorized to receive, by 24 gift, grant, donation, or otherwise any sum of money, aid or assistance from the 25 26 United States, the state of Louisiana, or any political subdivision thereof, and unless 27 otherwise provided by the terms of such gift, grant, or donation, in its discretion, to pledge all or any part of such monies for the further securing of the payment of the 28 29 principal and interest of its bonds or notes.

2	CHAPTER 30. THE PORT OF SOUTH LOUISIANA
3	§2471. Creation; membership
4	A. There is hereby created the Port of South Louisiana, as a political
5	subdivision of the state, with jurisdictional authority encompassing the geographical
6	boundaries of the parishes of Ascension, St. Charles, St. John the Baptist, and St.
7	James. The Port of South Louisiana shall be governed by a board of commissioners
8	to be known as the "Port of South Louisiana Commission", which shall be composed
9	of seven eleven members who shall be appointed as follows:
10	(1) One member from each parish within the territorial jurisdiction of the port
11	who is a resident of such parish, who shall be appointed by the respective parish
12	president with the concurrence of two-thirds of the members of the parish council of
13	that parish from the nominees submitted to him by the following organizations which
14	shall each submit one nominee:
15	(a) The Louisiana Farm Bureau.
16	(b) The Louisiana AFL-CIO.
17	(c) The Southern University River Parishes Alumni Association.
18	(d) The River Region Chamber of Commerce.
19	(e) The River Parishes Chemical Industry Council.
20	(f) The Grain Elevator and Processing Society.
21	(g) The Greater New Orleans Barge Fleeting Association.
22	(h) The New Orleans and Baton Rouge Pilots Association.
23	(2)(a) If any parish president fails, within sixty days of taking office, to
24	submit a name for appointment from his respective parish as provided in Paragraph
25	(1) of this Subsection, or if he fails to get concurrence of two-thirds of the respective
26	parish council on any such appointment, the commissioner from that parish shall be
27	appointed by the governor.
28	(b) If any parish president fails, within sixty days of the occurrence of any
29	vacancy on the commission, to submit a name for appointment to fill such vacancy,

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1	or if he fails to get concurrence of two-thirds of the respective parish council on any
2	such appointment, the commissioner from that parish shall be appointed by the
3	governor.
4	(3) $\frac{\text{Three}}{\text{Three}}$ members shall be appointed by the governor from a list of one
5	nominee from each parish located within the territorial jurisdiction of the port who
6	is a resident of such parish, or who may, instead of holding residency, be the chief
7	executive officer of a business which is principally operated within each such parish
8	submitted to him by each of the following organizations:
9	(a) Louisiana Farm Bureau.
10	(b) Louisiana AFL-CIO.
11	(c) Southern University River Parishes Alumni Association.
12	(d) River Region Chamber of Commerce.
13	(e) Westbank Civic Association.
14	(4) One member shall be appointed by the governor from a list of one
15	nominee each from each parish located within the territorial jurisdiction of the port
16	who is a resident of such parish, or who may, instead of residency, be the chief
17	executive officer of a business which is principally operated within each such parish
18	submitted to him by each of the following organizations:
19	(a) River Parishes Chemical Industry Council.
20	(b) Grain Elevator and Processing Society.
21	(c) Greater New Orleans Barge Fleeting Association.
22	(d) New Orleans and Baton Rouge Port Pilots Association.
23	(5) One member-at-large Three members-at-large who shall reside and be
24	are domiciled within the geographical boundaries of the port shall be appointed by
25	the governor. The person persons appointed shall be selected on the basis of his
26	their demonstrated experience in civic leadership and his ability and experience to
27	act effectively for the best interest of the port and the state of Louisiana.
28	(6) From the nominees submitted to the governor for appointment he shall
29	select one resident from each parish located within the territorial jurisdiction of the

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1	port, one of whom may, instead of residency, be the chief executive officer of a
2	business which is principally operated within such parish.
3	(7) Each appointment shall be submitted to the Senate for confirmation.
4	(8) The terms of all commissioners shall be concurrent with that of the
5	governor. Any subsequent vacancy on the commission for any reason shall be filled
6	for the unexpired portion of the term in the same manner as the original appointment.

8	§2473. Jurisdictional boundaries; rights and powers of commission and executive
9	director
10	A. The commission shall exercise the powers herein conferred upon it within
11	the port area consisting of the parishes of Ascension, St. Charles, St. John the
12	Baptist, and St. James as the boundaries and limits are presently fixed by law.

14	§2473.1. Additional rights and powers of the board and the executive director
15	* * *
16	B. In order to stimulate the commerce and industry in the port area and to
17	protect the public in its lives, health, and property, the port, in addition to any other
18	rights, powers, or authority granted to it, may provide services for and regulate the
19	traffic and commerce within the port area in such a manner as may in its judgment
20	be for the best interest of the public. Nothing herein contained shall be construed to
21	deprive the parishes of Ascension, St. Charles, St. John the Baptist or St. James, or
22	the governing bodies thereof of any rights or powers which they have or exercise
23	within the port area.

DIGEST

<u>Present law</u> creates the fifteen-member Greater Baton Rouge Port Commission that governs the Port of Baton Rouge and provides for its powers, duties, and responsibilities, with the jurisdictional authority encompassing the geographical boundaries of East Baton Rouge,

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West Baton Rouge, Iberville, and Ascension Parishes.

<u>Proposed law</u> removes Ascension Parish from the jurisdictional authority of the Port of Baton Rouge, and eliminates the two commissioners appointed by the governor from the parish of Ascension, and reduces the Greater Baton Rouge Port Commission <u>from</u> 15 to 13 members.

<u>Present law</u> creates the seven-member South Louisiana Port Commission that governs the Port of South Louisiana and provides for its powers, duties, and responsibilities, with the jurisdictional authority encompassing the geographical boundaries of St. Charles, St. John the Baptist, and St. James parishes.

<u>Proposed law</u> adds Ascension Parish to the jurisdictional authority of the Port of South Louisiana and increases the Port of South Louisiana Commission <u>from</u> 7 to 11 members. Adds one member for Ascension Parish who is appointed by the parish president with concurrence of two-thirds of the members of the parish council from a list of nominees submitted to him by certain organizations. Increases the number of members appointed by the governor from a list of nominees submitted by certain organizations to the list of organizations who submit nominees. Increases the number of members-at-large appointed by the governor from one to three.

<u>Present law</u> irrevocably pledges the full faith and credit of the parish of Ascension on a parity with that of the parishes of East Baton Rouge, West Baton Rouge, and Iberville in respect to the Commission's bonds, notes, and obligations presently outstanding, as well as to all bonds, notes, and obligations hereafter authorized, sold, and incurred by the Commission.

<u>Proposed law</u> limits the full faith and credit pledge of the parish of Ascension to the Commission's bonds, notes, and obligations outstanding on August 1, 2014.
