IDENTITY DATA. Constitutional amendment to protect personal identifiable information. (2/3-CA13sl(A))

1	A JOINT RESOLUTION
2	Proposing to add Article I, Section 28 of the Constitution of Louisiana, relative to the right
3	of security of personally identifiable information; to prohibit the sharing of
4	personally identifiable information collected by a state agency or a local government
5	agency; to provide for exceptions; to provide for remedies for violations; to provide
6	for standing; and to specify an election for submission of the proposition to electors
7	and provide a ballot proposition.
8	Section 1. Be it resolved by the Legislature of Louisiana, two-thirds of the members
9	elected to each house concurring, that there shall be submitted to the electors of the state, for
10	their approval or rejection in the manner provided by law, a proposal to add Article I,
11	Section 28 of the Constitution of Louisiana, to read as follows:
12	§28. Right to Security of Personally Identifiable Information
13	A. No state executive branch agency or local government agency shall
14	share any person's personally identifiable information with another agency,
15	private company, or anyone else without the express written permission of the
16	person or a warrant.
17	<b>B.</b> As used in this Subsection, "personally identifiable information" shall

2	alone or when combined with other personal or identifying information that is

4	C. The provisions of this Section shall not prohibit the sharing of
5	personally identifiable information by law enforcement personnel or
6	corrections' officials for legal or law enforcement purposes.
7	<b>D.</b> The provisions of this Section shall not prohibit the sharing of any
8	information that is considered by law to be a public record.
9	<b>E.</b> Any person adversely affected by the unlawful sharing of personally
10	identifiable information in violation of this Section shall have standing to raise
11	its illegality in the appropriate court.
12	Section 2. Be it further resolved that this proposed amendment shall be submitted
13	to the electors of the state of Louisiana at the statewide election to be held on November 4,
14	2014.
15	Section 3. Be it further resolved that on the official ballot to be used at said election
16	there shall be printed a proposition, upon which the electors of the state shall be permitted
17	to vote YES or NO, to amend the Constitution of Louisiana, which proposition shall read as
18	follows:
19	Do you support an amendment that would prohibit a state executive branch
20	agency or local government agency from sharing a person's personally
21	identifiable information with any other agency, private company, or anyone
22	else without the express written permission of the person or a warrant and
23	that would allow any person adversely affected by the unlawful sharing of
24	personally identifiable information to be able to raise the issue of its illegality
25	in the appropriate court, but would not prohibit the sharing of personally
26	identifiable information for legal or law enforcement purposes?

## DIGEST

Crowe (SB 295)

<u>Proposed constitutional amendment</u> provides that no state executive branch agency or local government agency shall share any person's personally identifiable information with another agency, private company, or anyone else without the express written permission of the person or a warrant.

<u>Proposed constitutional amendment</u> provides "personally identifiable information" means information that can be used to distinguish a person's identity, either alone or when combined with other personal or identifying information that is linked or linkable to a specific person.

<u>Proposed constitutional amendment</u> provides that the provisions of <u>proposed constitutional</u> <u>amendment</u> shall not prohibit the sharing of personally identifiable information between law enforcement personnel for a legal or law enforcement purpose.

<u>Proposed constitutional amendment</u> provides that any person adversely affected by the sharing of personally identifiable information in violation of <u>proposed constitutional</u> <u>amendment</u> shall have standing to raise its illegality in the appropriate court.

Specifies submission of the amendment to the voters at the statewide election to be held on November 4, 2014.
