STATE AGENCIES: Provides that an action by a state agency which results in the termination of one hundred or more employees or a change in the parish in which one hundred or more employees report to work shall not be effective or enforceable unless it meets certain requirements

1 AN ACT

2 To enact R.S. 49:200.2, relative to executive branch agencies; to provide certain
3 requirements prior to certain actions of a state agency in the executive branch
4 becoming effective or enforceable; and to provide for related matters.

5 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

6 Section 1. R.S. 49:200.2 is hereby enacted to read as follows:

7 §200.2. State agencies; requirements for certain actions

8 A. Any action by a state agency which results in the termination of one
9 hundred or more state employees or which results in a change of the parish in which
10 one hundred or more state employees report to work shall not become effective or
11 enforceable unless the action both:

12 (1) Complies with all applicable civil service rules and regulations.

13 (2) Is approved by the legislature either by law or by concurrent resolution.

14 B. For the purpose of this Section, a "state agency" is defined as any board,
15 commission, department, division, agency, office, or other entity within the
16 executive branch of state government.

Proposed law requires that any action by a state agency which results in the termination of 100 or more state employees or which results in a change of the parish in which 100 or more state employees report to work shall not become effective or enforceable until the action both complies with all applicable civil service rules and regulations and is approved by the legislature either by law or by concurrent resolution. Defines "state agency" as any board, commission, department, division, agency, office, or other entity within the executive branch of state government.
