STUDENT/LOANS-SCHOLARSHP: Provides relative to eligibility for Taylor Opportunity Program for Students (TOPS)

1	AN ACT
2	To amend and reenact R.S. 17:3048.1(A)(1)(b)(i), (c)(i)(aa), and (d)(i), relative to
3	qualifications for Taylor Opportunity Program for Students scholarships, to provide
4	with respect to eligibility requirements for participation in the program; and to
5	provide for related matters.
6	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
7	Section 1. R.S. $17:3048.1(A)(1)(b)(i)$, $(c)(i)(aa)$, and $(d)(i)$ are hereby amended and
8	reenacted to read as follows:
9	§3048.1. Program awards; eligibility; amounts; limitations; funding; administration
10	A.(1) As part of the Louisiana Taylor Opportunity Program for Students, the
11	state shall financially assist any student who enrolls on a full-time basis in a public
12	college or university in this state or a regionally accredited independent college or
13	university in the state that is a member of the Louisiana Association of Independent
14	Colleges and Universities, hereafter in this Chapter referred to collectively as
15	"eligible colleges and universities", to pursue an academic undergraduate degree or,
16	as provided by this Subsection, skill or occupational training as defined by the Board
17	of Regents, including a vocational or technical education certificate or diploma
18	program or a nonacademic undergraduate degree, and who meets the qualifications
19	of Subparagraph (b), (c), or (d) of this Paragraph and all of the applicable following
20	qualifications:

2	(b)(i) Has been certified as provided in Subsection D of this Section to have
3	graduated from a public high school or a nonpublic high school which has been
4	approved by the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education, has a
5	minimum cumulative grade point average of $\frac{2.50}{3.00}$ calculated on a 4.00 scale, has
6	a minimum composite score on the 1990 version of the American College Test
7	which is at least equal to or higher than the state's of the average composite score,
8	rounded to the nearest whole number, reported for students enrolled during the prior
9	year at the institution at which the student is enrolled but never less than twenty or
10	an equivalent concordant value on an enhanced or revised version of such test or on
11	the Scholastic Aptitude Test, and, unless granted an exception for cause by the
12	administering agency, has enrolled in an eligible college or university as a first-time
13	freshman not later than the semester, excluding summer semesters or sessions,
14	immediately following the first anniversary of the date that the student graduated
15	from high school or, if the student joins the United States Armed Forces within one
16	year after graduating from high school, has enrolled in an eligible college or
17	university as a first-time freshman not later than the semester, excluding summer
18	semesters or sessions, immediately following the fifth anniversary of the date that
19	the student graduated from high school; however, effective for the 1996-1997 school
20	year and thereafter, if, on or prior to the fifth anniversary of the date that the student
21	graduated from high school, the student reenlists in the United States Armed Forces
22	and maintains continuous active duty, the five-year period shall be extended to the
23	semester immediately following the one-year anniversary of the student's separation
24	from active duty service. As distinguished from all other students qualifying for this
25	program, a student who meets the requirements of this Subparagraph shall be the
26	recipient of an "Opportunity Award" for the purposes of this program.

28	(c)(i)(aa) Has been certified as provided in Subsection D of this Section to
29	have graduated from a public high school or nonpublic high school which has been

1 approved by the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education, has enrolled, 2 unless granted an exception for cause by the administering agency, in an eligible 3 college or university as a first-time freshman not later than the semester, excluding 4 summer semesters or sessions, immediately following the first anniversary of the date that the student graduated from high school, except as provided in Subitem (bb) 5 of this Item, has achieved a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.50 6 7 calculated on a 4.00 scale, and has a minimum composite score on the 1990 version 8 of the American College Test of twenty-three or higher the average composite score, 9 rounded to the nearest whole number, reported for students enrolled during the prior 10 year at the institution at which the student is enrolled or an equivalent concordant 11 value on any enhanced or revised version of such test or on the Scholastic Aptitude 12 Test. As distinguished from all other students qualifying for this program, a student who meets the requirements of this Subparagraph shall receive and be recognized as 13 14 the recipient of a "Performance Award" for the purposes of this program. * 15 16 (d)(i) Has been certified as provided in Subsection D of this Section to have 17 graduated from a public high school or nonpublic high school which has been

18 approved by the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education with a 19 minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.50 3.70 on a 4.00 scale and a 20 minimum composite score of twenty-seven or higher on the 1990 version of the 21 American College Test of the average composite score, rounded to the nearest whole 22 number, reported for students enrolled during the prior year at the insitution at which 23 the student is enrolled or an equivalent concordant value on any enhanced or revised 24 version of such test or on the Scholastic Aptitude Test, and, unless granted an exception for cause by the administering agency, has enrolled in an eligible college 25 26 or university as a first-time freshman not later than the semester, excluding summer 27 semesters or sessions, immediately following the first anniversary of the date that the 28 student graduated from high school or, if the student joins the United States Armed 29 Forces within one year after graduating from high school, has enrolled in an eligible

1	college or university as a first-time freshman not later than the semester, excluding
2	summer semesters or sessions, immediately following the fifth anniversary of the
3	date that the student graduated from high school; however, effective for the 1996-
4	1997 school year and thereafter, if, on or prior to the fifth anniversary of the date that
5	the student graduated from high school, the student reenlists in the United States
6	Armed Forces and maintains continuous active duty, the five-year period shall be
7	extended to the semester immediately following the one-year anniversary of the
8	student's separation from active duty service. As distinguished from all other
9	students qualifying for this program, a student who meets the requirements of this
10	Subparagraph shall receive and be recognized as the recipient of an "Honors Award"
11	for the purposes of this program.

13	Section 2. The provisions of this Act are applicable to students graduating from high
14	school during or after the 2014-2015 school year.

Abstract: Provides relative to eligibility requirements for participation in the Taylor Opportunity Program for Students (TOPS).

<u>Present law</u> provides with respect to the Louisiana Taylor Opportunity Program for Students (TOPS). Under the program, the state shall financially assist any student who enrolls on a full-time basis in a public college or university or a regionally accredited independent college or university to pursue an academic undergraduate degree or skill or occupational training, and who meets the qualifications of <u>present law</u>.

<u>Present law</u> provides general requirements for participation in the TOPS program. Requires students to have graduated from a public high school or a nonpublic high school which has been approved by the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education (BESE). Also requires that students be enrolled in an eligible college or university as a first-time freshman not later than the semester immediately following the first anniversary of the date that the student graduated from high school.

<u>Present law</u> provides with respect to the "Opportunity Award." Requires that the student has a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.50. Further requires that the student has a composite score on the American College Test (ACT) which is at least equal to or higher than the state's average composite score reported for the prior year but never less than 20 or

an equivalent concordant value on an enhanced or revised version of such test or on the Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT).

<u>Proposed law</u> changes required minimum grade point average to 3.00. Also deletes the minimum ACT score of 20 and replaces it with the average composite score reported for students enrolled during the prior year at the institution at which the student is enrolled.

<u>Present law</u> provides with respect to the "Performance Award." Requires that the student has a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.50. Further requires that the student has a composite score on the ACT of 23 or higher or an equivalent concordant value on any enhanced or revised version of such test or on the SAT.

<u>Proposed law</u> deletes minimum ACT score of 23 and replaces it with requirement that the minimum ACT score should be at least the average composite score reported for students enrolled during the prior year at which the student is enrolled or an equivalent concordant value on any enhanced or revised version of such test or on the SAT.

<u>Present law</u> provides with respect to the "Honors Award." Requires that the student has a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.50 and a score of 27 or higher on the ACT or an equivalent concordant value on any enhanced or revised version of such test or on the SAT.

<u>Proposed law</u> changes minimum grade point average to 3.70 and deletes the minimum ACT score of 27 and replaces it with requirement that the minimum ACT score should be at least the average composite score reported for students enrolled during the prior year at which the student is enrolled or an equivalent concordant value on any enhanced or revised version of such test or on the SAT.

Otherwise retains present law.
