AN ACT

To enact R.S. 33:2541.1(B)(1)(c), relative to the city of St. Martinville; to provide relative to the position of deputy chief of police; to include certain qualifications for deputy chief of police for the city of St. Martinville; to provide for an effective date; and to provide for related matters.

Notice of intention to introduce this Act has been published.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

Section 1. R.S. 33:2541.1(B)(1)(c) is hereby enacted to read as follows:

§2541.1. Deputy chief of police; competitive appointment

B.(1)(a) \* \* \*

**(c) Notwithstanding the provisions of Subparagraph (a) of this Paragraph, in the city of St. Martinville, the qualifications for the position of deputy chief of police shall be not less than five years of full-time law enforcement experience.**

\* \* \*

Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not

1 signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature  
2 by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If  
3 vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become  
4 effective on the day following such approval.

DIGEST

Mills (SB 564)

Present law provides for a deputy chief of police to have not less than eight years of full-time law enforcement experience and shall at least hold the rank of sergeant in the classified police service at the time of his appointment.

Proposed law provides for the qualifications for the position of deputy chief of police in the city of St. Martinville. Further provides that the candidate must have five years of full-time law enforcement experience.

Effective upon signature of governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
