CRIMINAL/PROCEDURE: Provides for a contradictory hearing for a motion to withdraw a guilty plea

1	AN ACT
2	To amend and reenact Code of Criminal Procedure Article 559(A), relative to the
3	withdrawal of a guilty plea; to require a contradictory hearing on any motion to
4	withdraw a guilty plea; to authorize the state to waive the contradictory hearing; and
5	to provide for related matters.
6	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
7	Section 1. Code of Criminal Procedure Article 559(A) is hereby amended and
8	reenacted to read as follows:
9	Art. 559. Withdrawal or setting aside of plea of guilty
10	A. The Upon motion of the defendant and after a contradictory hearing,
11	which may be waived by the state in writing, the court may permit a plea of guilty
12	to be withdrawn at any time before sentence.

Abstract: Provides for a contradictory hearing for a motion to withdraw a guilty plea and authorizes the state to waive such hearing.

CODING: Words in struck through type are deletions from existing law; words <u>underscored</u> are additions.

<u>Present law</u> provides that the court may permit a plea of guilty to be withdrawn at any time before the defendant is sentenced.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> but provides that a motion to withdraw a guilty plea may only be granted after a contradictory hearing which may be waived by the state.
