EMPLOYMENT. Requires public contractors to pay certain minimum wages to employees. (8/1/14)

AN ACT

2	To enact R.S. 38:2301 and R.S. 39:1555, relative to wages; to require public contractors to
3	pay certain prevailing minimum wages; to provide for the inclusion of certain
4	language in public contacts; and to provide for related matters.
5	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
6	Section 1. R.S. 38:2301 is hereby enacted to read as follows:
7	PART VI. PAYMENT OF PREVAILING WAGES
8	§2301. Prevailing wage; requirement of contractors
9	A. No person awarded a public contract pursuant to the provisions of
10	this Title shall pay any employee wages in an amount less than the prevailing
11	minimum wage set forth as follows:
12	(1) Beginning January 1, 2015, the amount of the minimum wage shall
13	be eight dollars and twenty-five cents per hour.
14	(2) Beginning January 1, 2016, the amount of the minimum wage shall
15	be nine dollars and twenty-five cents per hour.
16	(3) Beginning January 1, 2017, the amount of the minimum wage shall
17	be ten dollars and twenty-five cents per hour.

1	B. Every public contract and bidding document executed pursuant to
2	the provisions of this Title shall include a statement advising that by signing the
3	contract, the contractor agrees to pay the prevailing wage as provided for in this
4	Section.
5	C. The provisions of this Section shall not apply to any political
6	subdivision as provided for in Article VI of the Constitution of Louisiana and
7	as defined in Article VI, Section 44 of the Constitution of Louisiana.
8	Section 2. R.S. 39:1555 is hereby enacted to read as follows:
9	§1555. Prevailing wage; requirement of procurement contracts
10	A. No person awarded a procurement contract pursuant to the
11	provisions of this Title shall pay any employee wages in an amount less than the
12	prevailing minimum wage set forth as follows:
13	(1) Beginning January 1, 2015, the amount of the minimum wage shall
14	be eight dollars and twenty-five cents per hour.
15	(2) Beginning January 1, 2016, the amount of the minimum wage shall
16	be nine dollars and twenty-five cents per hour.
17	(3) Beginning January 1, 2017, the amount of the minimum wage shall
18	be ten dollars and twenty-five cents per hour.
19	B. Every public contract, invitation to bid, or request for proposal
20	pursuant to the provisions of this Title shall include a statement advising an
21	applicant that by signing the contract, bid document, or proposal, the applicant
22	agrees that the applicant will pay the prevailing wage as provided for in this
23	Section.
24	C. The provisions of this Section shall not apply to any political
25	subdivision as provided for in Article VI of the Constitution of Louisiana and
26	as defined in Article VI, Section 44 of the Constitution of Louisiana.

DIGEST

Peterson (SB 646)

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that no person awarded a public contract shall pay any employee a minimum wage which is less than the following:

- (1) Beginning January 1, 2015, the amount of the minimum wage shall be \$8.25 per hour.
- (2) Beginning January 1, 2016, the amount of the minimum wage shall be \$9.25.
- (3) Beginning January 1, 2017, the amount of the minimum wage shall be \$10.25.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that every contract, invitation to bid, or request for proposal shall include a statement advising that by signing the contract, the contractor agrees to pay the prevailing minimum wage.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the <u>proposed law</u> shall not apply to a parish, municipality, and any other unit of local government, including a school board and a special district, authorized by law to perform local governmental functions.

Effective August 1, 2014.
