FISH/FISHING. Provides for the Louisiana Catch and Cook Program within the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries. (8/1/14)

AN ACT

2	To enact R.S. 56:317, relative to fishing; to establish the Louisiana Catch and Cook Program
3	within the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries; to allow retail food establishments
4	to prepare certain recreational fish; to provide for the promulgation of rules; to
5	provide penalties, terms, conditions, and requirements; and to provide for related
6	matters.
7	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
8	Section 1. R.S. 56:317 is hereby enacted to read as follows:
9	§317. Louisiana Catch and Cook Program; preparation of recreational fish in
10	retail food establishments
11	A. Notwithstanding any provision of the state Sanitary Code or any other
12	law or regulation to the contrary, it shall be lawful for retail food establishments
13	to receive and prepare any freshwater or saltwater recreational fish as defined
14	<u>in R.S. 56:8.</u>
15	B.(1) The secretary of the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries is hereby
16	authorized to establish the Louisiana Catch and Cook Program, whereby a
17	retail food establishment shall be authorized to prepare any fish legally taken

by a licensed recreational fisherman.

2	(2) The program shall be established through the promulgation and
3	adoption of rules and regulations in conjunction with the Department of Health
4	and Hospitals and in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act. Such
5	rules and regulations shall include but are not limited to the following which
6	shall be enforced by Department of Health and Hospitals, office of public
7	health:
8	(a) The retail food establishment shall complete, date, and have the
9	recreational fisherman who brings the fish in for preparation sign an
10	assumption of risk form. The completed, dated, and signed form shall be
11	maintained at the establishment for a period of no less than ninety days. The
12	establishment shall provide the completed forms to the state health officer upon
13	<u>request.</u>
14	(b) The retail food establishment shall only receive fish that have been
15	cleaned, filleted, placed in clean, food-grade, single-service packaging, and
16	properly refrigerated.
17	(c) The retail food establishment shall inspect the fish for freshness and
18	proper receiving temperature.
19	(d) The fish shall be properly labeled with the date, time, and name of
20	the recreational fisherman.
21	(e) The retail food establishment shall store, prepare, and otherwise
22	handle the fish separately from products being prepared for and served to the
23	general public.
24	(f) The retail food establishment shall store, prepare, and otherwise
25	handle the fish in compliance with provisions of the state Sanitary Code.
26	(g) The retail food establishment shall prepare and serve the fish to the
27	recreational fisherman or any person at his table within four hours of receipt
28	of the fish.
29	(h) Containers, preparation tables, cutting boards, utensils, and other

2 cleaned and sanitized in accordance with provisions of the state Sanitary Code 3 prior to use preparing foods to serve to the general public. (i) The fish shall be served directly to the recreational fisherman or any 4 5 person at his table immediately upon the completion of cooking and shall not be served to the general public. 6 7 C. Any retail food establishment who wishes to participate in the 8 Louisiana Catch and Cook Program shall apply to the Department of Wildlife 9 and Fisheries to be issued a participation permit by the department. There shall 10 be no fee for the application process or permit. The permit may be suspended or revoked by the department for any violation of the rules and regulations of 11 this program. The Department of Wildlife and Fisheries shall provide the 12 13 names and locations of each participating retail food establishment to the Department of Health and Hospitals, office of public health upon request. 14 The original instrument was prepared by McHenry Lee. <u>Proposed law</u> authorizes retail food establishments to receive and prepare any freshwater or saltwater recreational fish.

<u>Proposed law</u> creates the Louisiana Catch and Cook Program within the DWF and authorizes the secretary, in conjunction with DHH, to promulgate rules and regulations for the program. Provides certain content and requirements of the rules.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the DWF to issue permits for retail food establishments who wish to participate in the program.

<u>Proposed law</u> prohibits any fee for the application process or permit.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the permit may be suspended or revoked by the DWF for any violation of the rules and regulations of the program.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the DWF to provide names and locations of participating retail food establishments to DHH, office of public health upon request.
