EMPLOYMENT/WAGES-MINIMUM

(Constitutional Amendment) Provides for a state minimum wage

Proposed constitutional amendment establishes a state minimum wage that shall be \$0.05 higher per hour than the federal minimum wage. Proposed constitutional amendment provides that the legislature may enact a minimum wage law that is higher than the minimum wage, and if so, the higher minimum wage shall be used. Proposed constitutional amendment provides for submission to the voters at the statewide election to be held 11/04/2014.

EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION

This proposed legislation will increase state governmental expenditures by at least \$2,303 in FY 15 as a result of additional salary expense.

Civil Service

Proposed legislation will increase state expenditures by a total of \$2,303 to fund the additional costs of the new minimum wage. According to State Civil Service, as of 01/31/2014, there are 37 when actually employed (WAE) employees projected to earn less than \$7.30 per hour (\$7.25 federal minimum wage + \$.05 per hour) on 11/04/2014. Therefore, to comply with the requirements of this legislation, additional state expenditures of \$2,303 additional state expenditures for WAE employees. Any classified employees making \$7.25 per hour are projected to receive annual 4% performance adjustment on October 1, 2014; therefore classified employees are not impact by this measure.
