SEX OFFENSE/REGISTRY

EG INCREASE GF EX See Note

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Amends the definition of criminal offense against a victim who is a minor to include certain convictions of stalking

<u>Present law</u> provides that persons convicted of certain sex offenses or certain criminal offenses against a victim who is a minor are required to register and provide notification. Provides for a definition of "criminal offense against a victim who is a minor" and provides that such persons are required to register for a period of fifteen years and update his registration in person annually from the date of initial registration.

<u>Proposed law</u> adds persons convicted of the crime of stalking, punishable by imprisonment at hard labor, against a person under the age of 18 to the definition of "criminal offense against a victim who is a minor". Provides that the provisions of <u>proposed law</u> apply to any person who is convicted or who is in the custody or under the supervision of DPS&C on or after the effective date of the <u>proposed law</u>.

EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION

The proposed legislation may result in an indeterminable increase in state general fund expenditures if any offender is sentenced as a result of the proposed legislation. The exact fiscal impact of the passage of this legislation is indeterminable, since it is not known how many people will be convicted of this crime. However, any offender sentenced to the custody of the Department of Public Safety and Corrections increases expenditures by \$24.39 per day, per offender in a local facility.

To the extent that offenders are housed in state facilities, the cost per day, per offender is \$52.51.

Additionally, upon release, there would be a possible future impact in the form of additional workload and time by Probation and Parole agents to supervise the added registration and notification requirements.

REVENUE EXPLANATION

There is no anticipated direct material effect on governmental revenues as a result of this measure. Any revenue generated through the imposition of fines created by this legislation would accrue to local government entities.
