A RESOLUTION

To recognize Thursday, May 1, 2014, as Lemonade Day for Ruston Elementary School in Ruston, Louisiana.

WHEREAS, Lemonade Day Louisiana is a free, community-wide program that fosters entrepreneurship and character development among Louisiana's youth by supporting them in establishing and operating their own lemonade businesses; and

WHEREAS, Lemonade Day Louisiana was founded in 2010 by John Georges and Todd Graves and has grown tremendously over the last few years; and

WHEREAS, over ten thousand youth across Louisiana participate in Lemonade Day Louisiana; and

WHEREAS, young entrepreneurs are encouraged to donate a portion of their proceeds to charity through the sales at lemonade stands and citizens are encouraged to purchase lemonade from the stands; and

WHEREAS, Lemonade Day Louisiana is sponsored by many major businesses and companies throughout the state, including Raising Canes, Chevron, Liberty Bank, Century Link, and United Healthcare; and

WHEREAS, Louisiana is one of over forty regions in the United States and Canada to participate in Lemonade Day.
