## **DIGEST**

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Seabaugh HB No. 533

**Abstract:** Prohibits the inclusion of the test scores of a student who has 10 or more unexcused absences in a semester in the value-added assessment model or other measures of student growth used in the teacher evaluation program.

<u>Present law</u> provides that every teacher and administrator who is employed by a local board shall be formally evaluated annually by the local school board pursuant to <u>present law</u>.

<u>Present law</u> provides that the elements of evaluation and standards for effectiveness shall be defined by the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education (BESE) and shall require that, at a minimum, local evaluation plans contain certain elements, including a job description, a professional growth plan, observation and conferencing, and classroom visitation.

<u>Present law</u> requires that one such element be a measure of effectiveness. Further provides that 50% of such evaluations shall be based on evidence of growth in student achievement using a value-added assessment model for grade levels and subjects for which value-added data is available.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that neither the value-added model nor other measures of student growth, in any given year, shall include a test score or data of a student who has 10 or more unexcused absences in any school semester in that year; otherwise retains present law.

## Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

Committee Amendments Proposed by House Committee on Education to the original bill.

1. Changes <u>proposed law</u> from providing that the model shall not include any test score of a student who is habitually absent or tardy as defined in <u>present law</u> (five unexcused occurrences in a semester if all reasonable efforts to correct the problem have failed) providing that the model shall not include any test score of a student who has 10 or more unexcused absences in any semester.

## House Floor Amendments to the engrossed bill.

1. Provided that the prohibition of inclusion of test scores of a student who has 10 or

more unexcused absences also applies to the measures of student growth for which value-added data are not available.

2. Specified that the prohibition of inclusion of test scores of a student who has 10 or more unexcused absences applies only to the year in which said absences occurred.
