HOUSE BILL NO. 802

BY REPRESENTATIVE BARROW AND SENATOR MILLS

1	AN ACT
2	To enact Part LXXV of Chapter 5 of Title 40 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, to
3	be comprised of R.S. 40:1300.381 through 1300.385, relative to toxic mold; to
4	provide for a task force to study the public health impacts of toxic mold in this state;
5	to provide for composition, functions, and duties of the task force; to terminate the
6	task force on a certain date; and to provide for related matters.
7	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
8	Section 1. Part LXXV of Chapter 5 of Title 40 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of
9	1950, comprised of R.S. 40:1300.381 through 1300.385, is hereby enacted to read as
10	follows:
11	PART LXXV. TOXIC MOLD TASK FORCE
12	<u>§1300.381. Legislative findings; declaration</u>
13	A. The legislature hereby finds the following:
14	(1) Certain forms of mold pose a severe and unacceptable risk to the
15	environment of Louisiana and the health of its people. Moreover, the legislature
16	finds that indoor toxins, specifically toxic mold, represent an insufficiently
17	understood health and environmental problem.
18	(2) The legislature recognizes that numerous studies indicate likely health
19	effects from mold spores, varying from cold-like symptoms to more serious
20	symptoms, such as allergy and asthma outbreaks. These toxins can have negative
21	effects on humans when ingested, inhaled, or when they come in contact with the

1	skin. These effects can have serious consequences for some population subgroups,
2	especially infants, children, pregnant women, persons who are elderly, asthmatics,
3	individuals with allergies, and individuals with compromised immune systems.
4	Healthcare professionals now acknowledge that molds can cause allergies, trigger
5	asthma attacks, detrimentally affect the function of vital human organs, and increase
6	susceptibility to colds and flu.
7	(3) The legislature further recognizes that though not all molds are toxic,
8	there are certain dangers that molds present within buildings and structures. It is thus
9	imperative that the toxicity of its presence be determined and a corresponding plan
10	of action be implemented to address such hazards in buildings and structures within
11	this state.
12	B. The legislature hereby declares that it is in the best interest of the public
13	health, welfare, and safety to establish a task force to lead development of
14	comprehensive policies and promote best practices concerning mitigation of toxic
15	mold and the adverse health effects caused by this unique threat to public health.
16	<u>§1300.382. Definition</u>
17	For the purposes of this Part, the term "mold" means any form of
18	multicellular fungi that live on plant or animal matter and in indoor environments.
19	Types of mold include but are not limited to cladosporium, alternaria, aspergillus,
20	trichoderma, memnoniella, mucor, and stachybotrys chartarum.
21	<u>§1300.383.</u> Toxic Mold Task Force; creation; composition; meetings
22	A. There is hereby created the Louisiana Toxic Mold Task Force, referred
23	to hereafter as the "task force", composed of fifteen members as follows:
24	(1) One pediatric environmental health specialist selected and appointed by
25	the secretary of the Department of Health and Hospitals.
26	(2) One person with expertise in toxicology selected and appointed by the
27	secretary of the Department of Health and Hospitals.
28	(3) The assistant secretary of the office of public health of the Department
29	of Health and Hospitals or his designee.

1	(4) One member designated by the office of health affairs and medical
2	education of the Louisiana State University System.
3	(5) One member designated by the Louisiana State Medical Society.
4	(6) One member designated by the Louisiana Primary Care Association.
5	(7) One member with expertise in consumer protection designated by the
6	Louisiana attorney general.
7	(8) One member designated by the Southern University Law Center.
8	(9) One member designated by the Paul M. Hebert Law Center of Louisiana
9	State University.
10	(10) One member with expertise in toxic mold remediation designated by the
11	Louisiana State Licensing Board for Contractors.
12	(11) One member designated by the Louisiana Housing Corporation.
13	(12) One member designated by the dean of the School of Public Health and
14	Tropical Medicine of Tulane University.
15	(13) One member designated by the Louisiana Realtors Association.
16	(14) One member designated by the Louisiana Home Builders Association.
17	(15) One member designated by the Apartment Association of Louisiana.
18	B. The secretary of the Department of Health and Hospitals shall take such
19	actions as are necessary to ensure that the initial convening of the task force occurs
20	no later than October 1, 2014.
21	C. The task force members shall select a chairman annually, and he shall
22	serve as chairman without salary.
23	D. Task force members shall serve without compensation, except per diem
24	or expense reimbursement to which they may be individually entitled by their
25	respective employer organizations.
26	E. The task force shall hold at least two regular meetings each year at a place
27	designated by the chairman.
28	<u>§1300.384.</u> Functions and duties of the task force
29	A. The functions of the task force shall include all of the following:

1	(1) Serve as an advisory body to the legislature on policies and practices that
2	protect all people of this state, particularly tenants, consumers, and vulnerable
3	populations, from harm related to toxic mold.
4	(2) Serve as a coordinating forum between and among state agencies, local
5	government, and nongovernmental groups on matters related to toxic mold.
6	(3) On a regular basis, research and review state regulations, guidelines,
7	policies, and procedures that pertain in any way to toxic mold and make
8	recommendations to the governor, the legislature, and the secretary of the
9	Department of Health and Hospitals as deemed necessary and appropriate by the
10	chairman.
11	B. On or before January 1, 2015, and annually thereafter, the task force shall
12	prepare and submit to the governor and the legislature a report on the status of public
13	health risks from toxic mold in Louisiana. The report shall include, without
14	limitation, the following:
15	(1) An assessment, based on scientific evidence, of the nature, scope, and
16	magnitude of the adverse environmental and health impacts caused by toxic mold in
17	the state.
18	(2) Measurement, based on scientific evidence, of the adverse health effects
19	of exposure to molds on the general population, including specific effects on any
20	subgroups identifiable as being at greater risk of adverse health effects when exposed
21	to molds.
22	(3) Identification of actions taken by the state, local governments, and any
23	other public or private organizations that have made a positive impact on mitigating
24	the harm to public health of toxic mold.
25	(4) Identification of best practices for the control of mold in a cost-effective
26	and environmentally sound manner.
27	C. The task force may request administrative and technical support from the
28	Department of Health and Hospitals, office of public health, to carry out the
29	functions and responsibilities provided in this Section.
