WHEREAS, originally hired as a janitor for the Lake Charles Country Club, George Williams stayed after hours to help in the club's kitchen in order to learn more about professional cooking; through hard work and his unyielding passion for Louisiana culinary traditions, he was eventually promoted to manager of the dining room and flambé chef; and

WHEREAS, flambé became his culinary signature and George Williams developed a complete repertoire of flambé recipes for every course of a meal, including salads and desserts; and

WHEREAS, in 1990, one of his flambé recipes won an American Culinary Federation competition in Lake Charles, after which George Williams adopted the moniker of "Flambé King"; and

WHEREAS, he continues to pursue his passion for Louisiana cooking while sharing his inspirational success story with others; he actively ministers and motivates others to realize their unique gifts and talents in order to share them with their community; he works to instill a sense of pride in hard work, friendship, and self-respect in others; and
