1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

2 To commend Councilman Curtis L. McCune upon his retirement after forty-two years of
3 public service.

4 WHEREAS, it is appropriate to commend Curtis L. McCune upon his retirement as
5 a council member for the town of Stonewall and to recognize him for his unwavering
6 dedication to public service; and

7 WHEREAS, Curtis L. McCune attended Stonewall High School and graduated from
8 Louisiana College, where he majored in chemistry; and

9 WHEREAS, Curtis L. McCune completed his graduate studies at Tulane University,
10 and he also attended numerous technical and managerial courses; and

11 WHEREAS, Curtis L. McCune worked for Thiokol Corporation for thirty-five years
12 of highly productive service, producing rocket motors and munitions for the United States
13 Armed Forces; and

14 WHEREAS, at Thiokol Corporation, Mr. McCune started out as a junior chemist and
15 was eventually promoted to chemist, chemical engineer, research chemist, chief chemist, and
16 quality director; and

17 WHEREAS, upon his retirement, Curtis L. McCune was the director of all quality
18 engineering and testing for the Longhorn Division of Thiokol Corporation; and

19 WHEREAS, for thirty-six years, Curtis L. McCune served with great distinction as
20 mayor of the town of Stonewall; and

1 WHEREAS, upon his retirement from the position of mayor, Mr. McCune was
2 elected council member for the town of Stonewall; and

3 WHEREAS, Curtis L. McCune is officially retiring from the Town of Stonewall, and
4 June 10, 2014, will be his final meeting as a member of the town council; and

5 WHEREAS, before serving as mayor, Mr. McCune spent two years as road
6 commissioner and devoted three years of his life to the service of his country; and

7 WHEREAS, over the years, much of Mr. McCune's time has been spent serving with
8 great distinction on local, parish, and regional committees; and

9 WHEREAS, Curtis L. McCune is a loving husband to his wife of sixty-two years,
10 Nancy McCune, and a devoted father and grandfather to his four children, nine
11 grandchildren, and ten great-grandchildren; and

12 WHEREAS, Curtis L. McCune merits a special measure of commendation for the
13 tremendous pride and honor that he brings to his family, friends, and community, the town
14 of Stonewall, and the state of Louisiana.

15 THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby
16 commend Curtis L. McCune upon his retirement from forty-two years of public service,
17 including four years as a council member and thirty-six years as the mayor of Stonewall,
18 does hereby recognize and record for posterity his outstanding accomplishments and
19 manifold contributions to his community, and does hereby extend best wishes for his
20 continued success and happiness in the years to come.
