2	To amend and reenact R.S. 14:102.23(B)(1) and (C) and to enact R.S. 14:102.23(D), (E),
3	and (F), relative to the crime of cockfighting; to provide for definitions; to provide
4	that possession of certain paraphernalia may be admissible as evidence of a
5	violation; to provide penalties upon conviction of cockfighting; to provide for
6	exceptions; and to provide for related matters.
7	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
8	Section 1. R.S. 14:102.23(B)(1) and (C) are hereby amended and reenacted and R.S.
9	14:102.23(D), (E), and (F) are hereby enacted to read as follows:
10	§102.23. Cockfighting
11	* * *
12	B. As used in this Section, the following words and phrases have the
13	following meanings ascribed to them:
14	(1) "Chicken" means any bird which is of the species Gallus gallus, game
15	fowl or rooster whether domestic or feral normally used in a cockfight.
16	* * *
17	C. Possessing, manufacturing, buying, selling, or trading of
18	paraphernalia such as spurs, gaffs, knives, leather training spur covers, and
19	other items or substances normally used in cockfighting with the intent that
20	they shall be used in a cockfight together with evidence that the paraphernalia
21	is being used or intended for use in the unlawful training of a chicken to fight
22	with another chicken, shall be admissible as evidence of a violation of this
23	Section. Whoever violates the provisions of this Subsection, upon conviction
24	shall be fined not more than five hundred dollars, or imprisoned for not more
25	than six months, or both. However, the provisions of this Section shall not be
26	construed to prohibit the possessing, buying, selling, or trading of any spurs,
27	gaffs, knives, leather training spur covers, or any other items normally used in

1	<u>cockfighting which are at least five years old and have historical value.</u>
2	$\underline{\mathbf{D}}_{\cdot}(1)$ Whoever violates the provisions of this Section, on conviction of a first
3	offense, shall be fined not more than one thousand dollars, or imprisoned for not
4	more than six months, or both.
5	(2) On a conviction of a second offense, the offender shall be fined not less
6	than seven hundred fifty dollars, nor more than two thousand dollars, or imprisoned,
7	with or without hard labor, for not less than six months nor more than one year, or
8	both. In addition to any other penalty imposed, on a conviction of a second first
9	offense, the offender shall be ordered to perform fifteen eight-hour days of court-
10	approved community service. The community service requirement shall not be
11	suspended.
12	(3)(2) On a conviction of a third second offense, the offender shall be fined
13	not less than one thousand dollars, nor more than two thousand dollars, and shall be
14	imprisoned, with or without hard labor, for not less than one year nor more than three
15	years. At least six months of the sentence imposed shall be served without benefit
16	of parole, probation, or suspension of sentence.
17	E. For the purposes of this Section, when more than one chicken is
18	subject to an act that would constitute cockfighting, each chicken involved shall
19	<u>constitute a separate offense.</u>
20	F. The provisions of this Section shall not be construed to prohibit the
21	raising of any chicken, rooster, or gamefowl for the purposes of personal
22	enjoyment, exhibition, or agricultural pursuits as long as the purpose of such
23	pursuits are legal.
