House Bill No. 155 by Representative Mack

LAW ENFORCE/OFFICERS: Provides with respect to supplemental pay for certain officers

Synopsis of Senate Amendments

1. No changes to bill as finally passed by the House.

Digest of Bill as Finally Passed by Senate

<u>Present law</u> requires every commissioned law enforcement officer employed on a full-time basis by a police agency of the state or its political subdivisions, other than DPS&C and the Dept. of Wildlife and Fisheries, who provides police services to the general public to receive supplemental compensation in the amount of \$500 per month to be paid by the state if the officer completed one year of service, was hired after March 31, 1986, and completed and passed a council-certified training program.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and further requires any P.O.S.T.-certified law enforcement officer employed on a full-time basis by DPS&C, Dept. of Wildlife and Fisheries, division of probation and parole, or any retired state police officer who receives supplemental compensation under the provisions of <u>present law</u>, to receive credit for their employment if they become employed with any other law enforcement agency for purpose of satisfying the one year of service requirement to receive supplemental compensation.
