# SENATE BILL NO. 98

#### BY SENATORS NEVERS AND THOMPSON AND REPRESENTATIVES BADON, BROADWATER, HENRY BURNS, CARMODY, LEBAS, LORUSSO, MILLER, MORENO, RITCHIE, ROBIDEAUX, SEABAUGH, SMITH, ST. GERMAIN, STOKES AND WOODRUFF

1	AN ACT
2	To amend and reenact the introductory paragraph of R.S. 17:3048.1(A)(1) and (b)(ii)(bb),
3	(c)(ii)(bb), and (d)(ii)(bb), the introductory paragraph of (B)(2)(c) and (C)(2)(e),
4	relative to the Taylor Opportunity Program for Students; to provide with respect to
5	the method used to calculate the grade point average required for program awards;
6	to provide that a five-point scale shall be used to calculate the grade point average
7	for certain honors, articulated, and gifted and talented courses; to provide that the
8	administering agency of the program shall define skill or occupational training for
9	which an eligible student may use a program award; to specify certain courses
10	among those for which the administering agency of the program may update names
11	and establish equivalencies; and to provide for related matters.
12	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
13	Section 1. The introductory paragraph of R.S. 17:3048.1(A)(1) and (b)(ii)(bb),
14	(c)(ii)(bb), and (d)(ii)(bb), the introductory paragraph of (B)(2)(c) and (C)(2)(e) are hereby
15	amended and reenacted to read as follows:
16	\$3048.1. Program awards; eligibility; amounts; limitations; funding; administration
17	A.(1) As part of the Louisiana Taylor Opportunity Program for Students, the
18	state shall financially assist any student who enrolls on a full-time basis in a public
19	college or university in this state or a regionally accredited independent college or
20	university in the state that is a member of the Louisiana Association of Independent
21	Colleges or and Universities, hereafter in this Chapter referred to collectively as
22	"eligible colleges or universities", to pursue an academic undergraduate degree or,
23	as provided by this Subsection, skill or occupational training as defined by the Board
24	of Regents, administering agency including a vocational or technical education
25	certificate or diploma program or a nonacademic undergraduate degree, and who

5	(bb) Beginning with students graduating in the 2017-2018 school year and
6	thereafter, the calculation of the minimum cumulative grade point average specified
7	in Item (i) of this Subparagraph shall utilize a five-point scale for grades earned in
8	certain Advanced Placement courses, International Baccalaureate courses, gifted and
9	talented courses, honors courses, articulated courses for college credit, and dual
10	enrollment courses as approved by the Board of Regents and the State Board of
11	Elementary and Secondary Education, which may result in a student earning a
12	cumulative grade point average that exceeds 4.00. For such courses, five quality
13	points shall be assigned to a letter grade of "A", four quality points shall be assigned
14	to a letter grade of "B", three quality points shall be assigned to a letter grade of "C",
15	two quality points shall be assigned to a letter grade of "D", and zero quality points
16	shall be assigned to a letter grade of "F".

20	(2) As part of the Louisiana Taylor Opportunity Program for
21	Students, for students graduating from high school through the 1999-2000
22	school year the state shall award an amount determined by the administering
23	agency to equal the actual cost of tuition of any student who enrolls on a full-
24	time basis in a Louisiana public postsecondary institution to pursue skill or
25	occupational training, including a vocational or technical education
26	certificate or diploma program or a nonacademic undergraduate degree, and
27	who meets the following qualifications and all other applicable qualifications
28	of this Chapter and for students graduating from high school during the 2000-
29	2001 school year and thereafter the state shall award an amount determined
30	by the administering agency in accordance with the provisions of

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1	Subparagraph (f) of this Paragraph for any student who enrolls on a full-time
2	basis in an eligible college or university as defined in Subsection A of this
3	Section to pursue skill or occupational training as defined by the Board of
4	Regents, including a vocational or technical education certificate or diploma
5	program or a nonacademic undergraduate degree, and who meets the
6	following qualifications and all other applicable qualifications of this
7	Chapter:

9	(c) Except as otherwise provided by this Section, has successfully
10	completed a core curriculum, and meets standards for admission to the
11	desired eligible college or university. The core curriculum specified in
12	Subparagraph (b) of this Paragraph shall be effective only for high school
13	graduates through the 2001-2002 school year; thereafter, a student shall meet
14	the core curriculum requirements as specified in this Subparagraph. Except
15	as otherwise provided by this Section, a student may qualify for a TOPS-
16	Tech Award by meeting the core curriculum requirements of Subparagraph
17	(A)(1)(e) <u>or (f)</u> of this Section or the core curriculum defined as follows:

21	(2) Except as otherwise provided by this Paragraph, the
22	administering agency by rule shall provide for:

24	(e) Guidelines and procedures by which the administering agency,
25	subject to prior approval by the State Board of Elementary and Secondary
26	Education, may update the course name and establish course equivalencies
27	for any course included in the definition of core curriculum provided by this
28	Section, including necessary changes to course names and equivalencies
29	for Advanced Placement and International Baccalaureate courses as
30	prescribed by the College Board or the International Baccalaureate

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1	<b>Foundation</b> . The guidelines and procedures shall include but not be limited
2	to a requirement that any change in a course name and the establishment of
3	any course equivalency be done by rule adopted by the administering agency
4	and a requirement that prior to issuing a notice of intent to consider any such
5	rule the administering agency shall consult with and seek the written
6	comments and recommendations of the Board of Regents on making the
7	name change or establishing the course equivalency.

9	Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not
10	signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature
11	by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If
12	vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become
13	effective on the day following such approval.
